A Lenten Reflection:

In St. Paul's Letter to the people in Philippi, Chapter2:6 we read "Though He was in the form of God, He did not deem equality with God something to be grasped at. Rather, He emptied Himself and took the form of a slave being born in the likeness of men. He was known to be of human estate, and it was thus that He humbled Himself. obediently accepting even death. death on a cross".

My seminary Christology course made me quite aware of the fact that as Jesus matured there was a growing consciousness within Himself as to who He was and what His mission entailed. I often wondered as he moved around Galilee, exactly what did He see? Answers to this question came as He chose His disciples. Imagine - fishermen, tax collector, zealot, thief and really not a whole lot of information about the other disciples. As we prayerfully examine the Gospels we realize that Jesus saw their hearts and He knew their potential. My question was what did they see in each other? Were they sometimes at odds with each other either in or out of Jesus' presence? Given sociological circumstances how did they feel about each other? How did Peter, the fisherman, feel about hanging out with Matthew, the tax collector? We read that Peter was highly opinionated and rambunctious. I would imagine the others had their feelings and opinions also. Somehow this ragtag group of guys were able to surmount individual personalities and temperaments, their different experiences, backstories, and professions and allow this itinerant preacher to take them to a place where they saw goodness, value, love, strength and so much more in each other that they would never have acknowledged prior to Jesus' call to follow him. Unfortunately Judas was the only one who couldn't seem to get out of his own way and accept the fact that He was loved, understood and forgiven.

What about us this Lent? Can we step out of our own wavs and see what Jesus saw and sees? Do we see our own backstories, strengths, gifts, and try to figure out "how do I build community" as Jesus built community with an unlikely bunch of guys? Are we that different? Instead of so easily acknowledging what my eyes might tell me is difficult and impossible, can I allow my faith to lead me to trust and see the Spirit at work? Let's let that Spirit lead us to all truth and joy. Let's make all things right this Lent.
