From the Pastor:

"Who knows what miracles we can achieve when you believe, somehow you will..."

A few nights ago I was channel surfing half asleep when Pentatonix, an acapella musical group appeared on the screen. They were singing at the Las Vegas Rescue Mission and these words resurrected so many thoughts and images. The name of the song is "When You Believe" from the movie Prince of Egypt released in 1998. Of course many renditions of this song have been released over the course of the years but for some reason I was left deep in thought for the rest of the evening.

One of those images was a painting I saw in the Holy Land entitled the Death of St. Joseph. Jesus and Mary were sitting at his bedside when he was dying. I thought then as I do now that we don't ordinarily think about the death of St. Joseph. We don't read or hear too much about St. Joseph in scripture, but we do know he quietly, humbly and obediently with an abundance of trust, did what was asked of him, fulfilling a request that was made of him by an angel in a dream. As I thought about St. Joseph I think about so many of us who unbeknownst to ourselves are working quiet miracles in families, households, jobs, and our respective communities. Most often no one is looking for attention but simply out of love and duty the job gets done. The lyrics continue - "We were moving mountains long before we knew we could..." How many folks do you know have accomplished the seemingly impossible And Still Do? They wonder how do they do it all. People admire them as they witness to love and faith and hope all the while sometimes not even realizing that their strength and courage is drawn from that **babe in the manger** that came to make all things possible.

I too dream as St. Joseph dreamed. Many dreams come as confirmations of what was, affirmations of what is and premonitions (sometimes warnings) of things to come. Our Father uses every means possible to guard and guide, protect and inspire us as we journey through this life. Perhaps as we celebrate this Christmas Day and gaze at our manger scenes let us Go To St. Joseph in prayer, seeking his intercession so as to quietly, humbly and obediently and with a great deal of trust present ourselves to Our Lord. God the Father, needed St. Joseph. God, The Father needs YOU. Yes, there can be miracles when you believe and even more so acknowledge the fact that maybe, just maybe, **YOU** are the miracle that someone has needed and continues to need THIS CHRISTMAS.
