2014 PARISH UPDATE

Greetings of Peace

The peace of Jesus the newborn Christ be with all of you!

Almost two months ago, October 26, a profile of the parish had been presented to you. The parish profile has pointed out to us our strengths and weaknesses, our past achievements and present and future challenges. The profile made us aware of the *trend of decline* that the parish has experienced for, at least, the past five years. And I believe that there is unanimity among us to focus on and to promote a *trend of increase* in our parish. The trend of increase is the only mentality and behavior that is proper to any true Christian because it is consonant with Jesus' Great Commission, the command he left to all of us, meaning, to you and to me: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them all that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20).

We take advantage of our Christmas attendance to reach out to all parishioners. We are all in this together: our strength as a people of God comes both from God and from our personal commitment to Jesus Christ and His Church. This Christmas, God's faith in all of us is put into flesh in and through the humanity of Jesus. This Christmas, can we all personally renew putting into flesh our faith in God, in His Son Jesus and in His Church in and through our own humanity? Now is the time to renew our active involvement in the life of our parish.

In this Christmas bulletin insert, you will find the Parish Strategic Plan, a fruit of the profile, prayer and discernment. In it, practical steps that are concretized in goals, objectives and corresponding activities so that all of us may be guided on how to own and nurture a mentality and behavior that fosters a trend of increase. This mentality and behavior prompts and challenges us to become intentional disciples, intentional missionaries and intentional stewards.

As **intentional disciples**, the focus is on *God calling us to gather as a community of disciples, first and foremost, to encounter Jesus Christ*. Without this personal encounter with Jesus Christ within His Church, there is no Christian disciple. To reflect -

- How often to I pray so as to encounter God who desires what is good for me and for others?
- How often do I read the Scriptures/Bible? How do I allow the Word of God to guide my way of living?
- How often do I celebrate the sacraments, in particular the Mass and the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation? Through these sacraments do I allow God to embrace me with His love and mercy, to nourish me with His Word and the Body and Blood of His Son Jesus?
- How often do I engage in activities the nurture my Christian faith to grow—retreats, reading a spiritual book, the catechism, the life of a saint, listening to a credible Catholic speaker?

As intentional missionaries, the focus is on Jesus sending us forth into our part of the world, which can easily be our family, our circle of friends, our workplace and our local community. To encounter Jesus is to be sent by Jesus as a missionary, as an apostle. The faith that Jesus gives us is not to be kept to ourselves but meant to be shared to others.

- How do I attend to the spiritual needs of my family? Do I nourish them by praying with them and by doing faith-sharing with them?
- Would people in my school, my workplace and my local community know that I am Catholic by the way I live my life and by the way I share my faith with people around me?
- Do I invite and bring in new people to encounter Jesus in His Church?

As intentional stewards, the focus in on supporting the mission of Jesus through my gifts of time, talent and treasure.

- Do I share my time, that is, my presence to support parish events and activities?
- Do I share my talents with others by being involved in parish ministries and organizations?
- Do I share my treasure, that is, my financial resources to advance the spread of the Gospel through our parish, local charities and other moral causes?

The sharing of the Parish Strategic Plan with you is a testament that we care for our parish and for one another. It is not meant to overwhelm any of us but simply to focus our attention on the beautiful of work of evangelization that lies ahead of us.

May this Christmas grant us the grace to allow the incarnate Son of God lead us to live fully the beauty of our faith.
