Periodically the bulletin will feature reviews of books being read by groups in our parish. Today's review is about a book the Book Club read recently.

Hail, Holy Queen: The Mother of God in the Word of God, by Scott Hahn

Drawn from a desire to deepen our reverence for Mary, the Women's Book Group recently finished reading this most enlightening book about the Blessed Virgin Mary. Those who wish to become more knowledgeable and reflective about a central aspect of their faith will grow spiritually as they journey through **Hail, Holy Queen**. This book helps us to understand what is taught about Mary, to appreciate her as she is shown directly and foreshadowed in the Holy Scriptures, and to explain about her to those who do not have a clear understanding of Mary's place in our Catholic faith. You will be moved toward a greater devotion to Mary after reading this book.

Scott Hahn has tried to explain in simple terms why Catholics venerate Mary. One of the things we liked about this book is that it was not "beyond understanding". While his text is serious, Scott Hahn has a playful practice of making puns with chapter and section headings. For example: "I Dream of Genealogy" introduces the genealogies of Matthew and Luke. "Idol Talk?" addresses the notion that some non-Catholics charge that Marian dogmas add up to Mary worship. Another aspect of his writing we were drawn to is that Dr. Hahn includes his own very humbling experiences to demonstrate how the Lord, whom he had served as a Protestant, introduced him to his mother. He begins by recalling his own intolerance of anything Marian, even the ripping up of his grandmother's rosary, when it was bequeathed to him.

As we read this book we thought about how, at times, when God calls us to do things we may grumble, complain, question, and think...this is too hard...I don't have the time...someone else will do it. We can think of a million REALLY good reasons to not answer the call. Yet Mary was someone who was willing to sacrifice for the will of God. Never once did Mary question WHY. Mary did not say NO! Having read this book one is also left with a greater desire to honor Mary and to say YES, I have a desire to serve.

Quarterly Social Ministry Report for Oct. Nov. and Dec. 2016

During this quarter, Social Ministry Outreach helped 8 households. One family was helped with part of their rent, two families were helped with part of their security deposit, and one family, facing eviction, was helped with part of the down payment to purchase a mobile home. The total housing cost was \$1352. Two families were helped with a water bill for a total of \$377.33. One person was helped with a car payment, needed to get to work, for \$269.69. And one elderly woman was helped with a furnace repair for \$81. Of those helped, three were from Wolcott, three were from Red Creek, one from South Butler, and one from Sodus. In addition, there were a total of 97 food vouchers honored for \$748.69 and \$500 given to the Clothing Center to purchase winter coats and other items not donated in sufficient quantity to meet the need. Total expenses were \$3,328.71.

Two people asked for assistance and were denied, one who did not keep the appointment, and one who lived out of the area we serve.

During this quarter, we received donations of \$1397.44 from our generous parishioners, and once again the Auer Family Foundation awarded us a grant of \$4000! Thank you all.



Parish Scripture Study

Thanks to all of you who signed up to increase in knowledge of your faith through a study of Holy Scripture. Scripture study will begin the week of April 17th and will conclude the week of June 12th.

For your convenience, two sessions will be offered each week; an evening session to be held on Tuesdays from 6:30 to 7:45 PM at St. Thomas and a morning session to be held on Thursdays from 9:30 to 10:45 at St. Mary Magdalene.
