Living in Grace through the Sacraments

Sacrament of Baptism. We share in your joy as we
welcome the newest member of your family into God's
family, the Church. Our Parish offers Baptism Prepara-
tion Program to parents, with godparents, who wish to
share their faith with their child. To register, please call
the Parish Office.

Sacrament of Reconciliation. Persevere on the jour-
ney to holiness: Say "No" to sin and "Yes" to God's
love, mercy and forgiveness: **Sunday's after mass, at
St. Mary Magdalene, St. Thomas/St. Jude and on
the 1st Tuesdays of the month at 6:30pm at St. Mary
Magdalene** or call the Parish Office to make an ap-
pointment.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Jesus con-
tinues his healing ministry through his Church. If you
or any parishioner is ill at home, in the hospital or the
nursing home, and desires to celebrate this sacrament
of healing, call the Parish Office to schedule a visit.

Sacrament of the Eucharist. One of our priests will
bring Communion during home visits or Extraordinary
Ministers of Holy Communion (communion ministers)
can and may bring you communion regularly. Call the
Parish Office.

Sacrament of Confirmation. Our young parishioners
who wish to prepare to receive the gift of the Holy Spir-
it in the sacrament of Confirmation must be enrolled in
a 2 year preparation program in Religious Education.
Adults must call the rectory.

Sacrament of Marriage. You and your fiancé are
called to mirror the love of Jesus for his Church! Please
contact the Parish Office at least six months before the
intended date of your wedding so we can help you pre-
pare for this wonderful sacrament of committed love.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. Do pray for vocations to
the ordained priesthood and permanent diaconate. It is
our common obligation to raise vocations—ordained,
religious, married, single—in the Church. Now do you
happen to know if and when our parish has produced
an ordained priest for our diocese?

**From the desk of Fr. Walter
An Easy Way to Start Praying**
My Dear People,

Many people have trouble **knowing
where to start when it comes to praying.** Let’s
be honest, this is a normal reaction, since prayer
is *speaking to God*, and God is, by His nature,
invisible. Some people wait to pray until some ideal
combination of emotional and spiritual condi-
tions intersect to provide the ‘right moment.’ I think
(from my experience speaking with people), that a
lot more people struggle with this than admit
openly. Here’s an easy solution: **the rosary.**

The rosary is a very simple prayer—at its
core merely saying the Our Father and Hail Mary
(you can’t get much simpler than that to start),
while thinking about certain events in the life of
Jesus and Mary. Some people think the rosary is
too simple! Or, because it’s so easy to get dis-
tracted when praying it, they give up trying to say
it, thinking it’s just not worth it. **Let me make a
very important point, it is much better to pray
badly, than to not pray at all.** Not praying be-
cause we get distracted is like not eating because
the food isn’t perfectly nutritious and organic. No
one would withhold feeding a starving person until
the ideal food was found. God knows we are try-
ing, and certainly Our Lady does as well. That’s
the point!

We are all children in our faith, however
old we may be. Children are part of a family and
get help from their parents and brothers and sis-
ters. Our spiritual life is the same in God’s plan;
we come to Jesus (and through Him to the Trinity)
with the help of our spiritual family. **Praying the
rosary (even badly), is our way of taking
Mary’s hand and allowing her to bring us to
Jesus, and all His saving acts.** The “Mysteries”
of the Rosary are not empty historical events or
charming mythologies, but living and powerful mo-
ments of salvation history which we ‘touch’ by
faith. In fact, we are *entering into them* and getting
untold blessings and graces through the hands of
Mary.

Saying “I need to pray more” (or pray at
all) will likely remain a vague, unaccomplished
ideal, but saying “I need to say a decade of the
rosary every day” is very doable. How many
blessings will come from the easy fulfillment of
this little resolution! It’s likely we’re not going to
experience spiritual ecstasy when we begin to
pray it, but that’s not what a true relationship is
about, even with God. Relationships are about
communication, and the rosary teaches us to *talk
to Jesus through Mary*. Don’t wait until things are
‘perfect’ to pray the rosary—**begin today**. Mary is
waiting to shower Heaven’s blessings upon us
and intercede with Jesus for all of our needs.
Make Our Lady happy, and let her help you to
know, love and serve Jesus!
