#### NEW UPDATE ON FAMILY PROMISE

The Family Promise Program has been expanding and flourishing. Several families have been placed into sustainable housing in recent months, and more families are waiting to get into the program. Thirteen plus churches are currently hosting these families in Wayne County with meals and overnight beds. As the program continues to grow, there is an agreed upon purchase offer with St. Joseph the Worker Parish to purchase the Rectory at St. Michael's Church in Lyons for use as the new Day Center. This will provide greater flexibility to meet the needs as the program expands.

It has been one year since we here at CCBT did the tag tree drive. As more and more families use the program, the need is increasing to keep the Day Center stocked with items and gas in the cars for all the transport. Thus, our Social Ministry Team has posted more tags at the backs of our churches for parishioners to take a tag, purchase the item and return it to the church in the labeled receptacle, or give the item to Pam AuClair, Kathy DeMass, Cathy Immerman, Jill Lee, or Marie Smith. This will be an effective way for CCBT to contribute to this ecumenical effort.

#### From the desk of Fr. Walter

The Beginning of Wisdom

My Dear People,

Last week I wrote to you about the difference between information and wisdom. We are inundated with information, noise and data, and yet we are desperately in need of wisdom. You're not going to find this sort of wisdom on the News, in self-help books or in the checkout line of a store. This is why I encouraged you to get and actually read from the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Even the Bible references alone make it worth your time. But what about wisdom itself? How do we get it? Reading the Catechism is certainly a good start, but it's not the only ingredient necessary.

The book of Proverbs contains a famous phrase which offers us a key insight: The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom (Proverbs 9:10). Many times, you find that the Bible qualifies as good, or 'just', those people who 'fear the Lord'. Fear is not a positive word for us. We typically fear things which are evil and can harm us, and so we avoid them. This is not what the fear of God is, in other words, avoiding Him. But we can 'fear' someone who is good, out of respect, as in a coach, a teacher, or a parent. We can fear offending them, or hurting them, or displeasing them.

The Bible highly prizes this 'fear of the Lord'. For example, Psalm 34, v. 11 invites: Come, children, hearken to me, I will teach you the fear of the Lord. Now, if the biblical 'fear' isn't fright, there is a connection between our ordinary meaning. Truly, great, overwhelming or powerful things normally produce in us a reaction of awe and respect. A lion, the ocean, or even human love can be 'frightening'. We should have a healthy respect for what is magnificent, awesome (in the true sense) or untamable. Authentic love should make us respect another person. The biblical fear of the Lord is all of these and more. At its root it is a holy respect and reverence for God who is All Powerful and All Good. This reverence towards the supreme holiness and 'otherness' of God lays the foundation for any ordered relationship with Him.

Unfortunately, modern Western society has in many ways lost any real respect for God. For many young people the idea that there is an All Powerful God who will hold them accountable for their actions, has a plan for them, and to Whom they owe worship is not even remotely in their world view. If "me" is the center of the universe, then God certainly can't be Lord.

Respect is needed for love, as every happily (or unhappily) married couple knows. Reverence for God is needed to know and love Him. This is true wisdom, or its beginning at least, and the foundation of our salvation and eternal happiness. Let's all be truly wise Christians.
