

Living in Grace through the Sacraments

Sacrament of Baptism. We share in your joy as we welcome the newest member of your family into God's family, the Church. Our Parish offers Baptism Preparation Program to parents, with godparents, who wish to share their faith with their child. To register, please call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of Reconciliation. Persevere on the journey to holiness: Say "No" to sin and "Yes" to God's love, mercy and forgiveness: Sunday's after Mass, at St. Mary Magdalene, before and after Mass at St. Thomas/St. Jude and on the 1st Tuesdays of the month at 6:30pm at St. Mary Magdalene or call the Parish Office to make an appointment.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Jesus continues his healing ministry through his Church. If you or any parishioner is ill at home, in the hospital or the nursing home, and desires to celebrate this sacrament of healing, call the Parish Office to schedule a visit.

Sacrament of the Eucharist. One of our priests will bring Communion during home visits or Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (communion ministers) can and may bring you Communion regularly. Call the Parish Office.

From the Desk of Father Walter: Why do we have to struggle?

My Dear People,

It can sometimes feel like God doesn't treat His friends very well. Living a serious Christian life can be frustrating at times, even when we are truly doing our best and seemingly using all the means (like prayer and the sacraments) God gives us to stay close to Him and to do His will, to serve Him and others for love of Him.

But if you read the lives of the saints, and especially the Bible itself, you see that this frustration finds echo among God's closest friends and helpers. No sooner does it seem that God sets us on the right path, making sure that His way is clear, when obstacles, interior and exterior, come up to make our way more and more difficult. Some people have a very profound and deep conversion. At such a time, they discover the truth of their Catholic Faith and how much God loves them. Having a desire to love and serve him in return, they then find that all the old habits of sin and self rise up to frustrate their good will. It seems like an authentic and sincere Christian life is unattainable, reserved for an

But the point is this...this struggle is the authentic Christian life, this is what it means to follow Jesus and to try to know and love Him. To follow Jesus is to follow Him as we really are, and not as we imagine ourselves to be. We follow Him in all the ugliness of real life, and in circumstances that seem anything but ideal.

The Cross that Our Lord would give us isn't the one we would carry grandly and elegantly and heroically, but the one (or ones) like His, that is, an instrument of torture that God can use to save us. Jesus' cross was anything but beautiful, but His love made it the instrument of our salvation, of my salvation and yours.

God lets His friends struggle, not because He's abandoned them, but because He loves them. He knows the best way to teach us to love. To love in the way that will prepare us for heaven. What happens in heaven? God gives Himself to us eternally in an ecstasy of joy and happiness. How is my daily struggle a preparation for this? Well, it's teaching me, painfully, slowly, how much I need God more than myself, and letting Him enter into my innermost being by making my Faith and Hope in His power grow. The very fact that I don't always feel this freedom is how He's actually freeing me. I am dying to self in order to rise in Him. His power is made strong in human weakness, in my weakness, in your weakness.

Don't fear your struggles, only fear not giving them to God. He knows how to use them. He is God. That's the secret of the Cross, which for us as Christians, however hard it may seem, is a secret of love.
