Sacrament of Baptism. We share in your joy as we welcome the newest member of your family into God's family, the Church. Our Parish offers Baptism Preparation Program to parents, with godparents, who wish to share their faith with their child. To register, please call the Parish Office.
Sacrament of Reconciliation. Persevere on the journey to holiness: Say "No" to sin and "Yes" to God's love, mercy and forgiveness. St. Mary Magdalene in the Church Hall on Saturday evenings 3:30 to 4:15 PM, St. Jude's in the old Sacristy on Sunday morning from 7:20 to 7:50 AM, or please call the Parish Office to make an appointment.
Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Jesus continues his healing ministry through his Church. If you or any parishioner is ill at home, in the hospital or the nursing home, and desires to celebrate this sacrament of healing, call the Parish Office to schedule a visit.
Sacrament of the Eucharist. One of our priests will bring Communion during home visits or Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (communion ministers) can and may bring you Communion regularly. Call the Parish Office.
Sacrament of Confirmation. Our young parishioners who wish to prepare to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit in the sacrament of Confirmation must be enrolled in a 2 year preparation program. Adults must call the rectory.
Sacrament of Marriage. You and your fiancé are called to mirror the love of Jesus for his Church! Please contact the Parish Office at least six months before the intended date of your wedding so we can help you prepare for this wonderful sacrament of committed love.
Sacrament of Holy Orders. Do pray for vocations to the ordained priesthood and permanent diaconate. It is our common obligation to raise vocations—ordained, religious, married, single—in the Church.

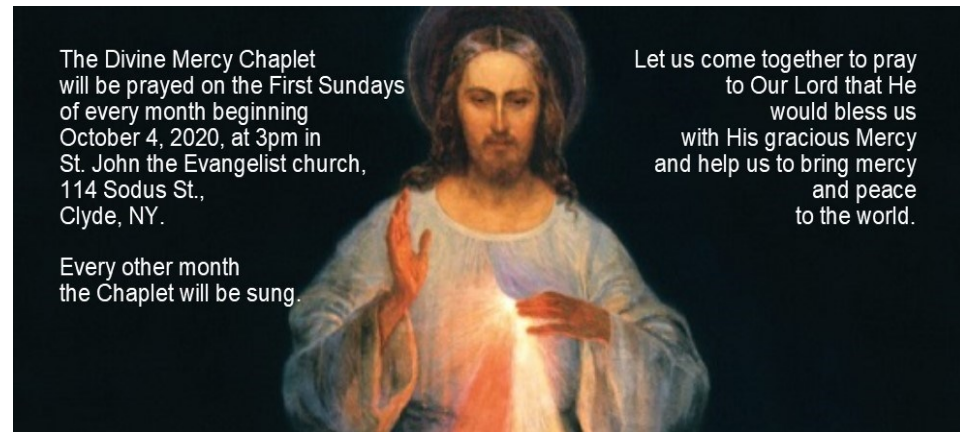

DIOCESE OF ROCHESTER PERMANENT DIACONATE: The deacon is a man of faith, who is called from the community that already recognizes his dedication to service. He makes a lifetime commitment to serving the People of God by proclaiming the Word, assisting and presiding at liturgies, and ministering in the areas of charity and social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church. The Diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate, at edward.giblin@dor.org, for additional information. A potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years of age at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation. He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquiry. Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith and a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to the permanent diaconate.

From Father Michael Merritt:

Raise your hand if you have ever said or done anything to someone that you immediately regretted.

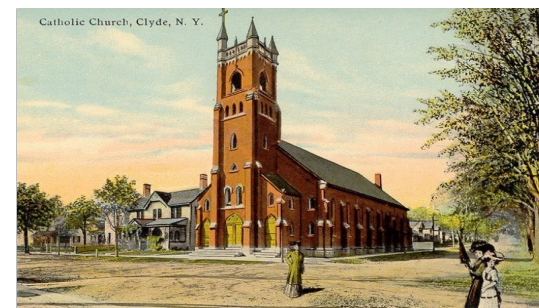
My guess is that just about everyone who is reading this is either raising their hand or at least nodding in agreement. We all make mistakes; we all say and do things that we wish we could take back. But of course, we can't take it back. When we say or do something hurtful to someone, the guilt can eat away at us. It becomes a huge weight on our shoulders, a terrible burden to bear. The same is true with our sins. Our sins are our offenses against God, and the guilt of our sins can weigh us down as much as an offense against a family member or close friend. Often, however, we don't even realize how much it is affecting us, until we go to the sacrament of confession and feel the weight lift off our shoulders. I have said this before, but there have been times where I have seen people almost float out of the confessional after their confession, because they feel so much lighter and freer with the weight of sin off their shoulders.

Just as we need forgiveness from God, so to do we need to forgive others who wronged us. God forgives us our sins because he loves us so much. All he asks is that we show that same type of compassion and love to others. So, if you are struggling to forgive someone who has wronged you, or are still holding on to a grudge, I encourage you to try and let go of that anger and bitterness. Seek them out and try for a reconciliation. Even if they haven't yet asked you for forgiveness, seek them out anyway. They might not know how to approach you to apologize. The pain that is eating at you might also be eating at them as well. That simple act of forgiveness might be able to bring healing to both you and the other person as well. Share God's merciful loving spirit as often as you can. Remember, to err is human, but to forgive is divine.

Catholics Care. Catholics Vote. Register to vote for Election Day (November 3, 2020)

In their statement on *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, the U.S. Catholic bishops remind Catholics, "We are called to bring together our principles and our political choices, our values and our votes, to help build a better world" (no. 14). In New York State, the voter registration deadline for the November 3 election is October 9. You can pick up a mail-in voter registration form at your county Board of Election (*we will have mail-in forms in church) or onlinevoterreg.dmv.ny.gov/motorvoter. New York State allows early voting from October 24 through November 1. Contact your county Board of Election to apply for a *mail-in ballot* allowed for anyone concerned about COVID-19.
