

## Message from a Family Promise Graduate

"When I first came into family promise, I was emotionally drained, nervous and didn't know what to expect. My first week was so smooth and coordinators were so sweet and very helpful. They provided food, household items, and were just there to help me save money and find my own place. My Main coordinator was able to get me approved for flacra, then only had 30 days to find a place. I ended up taking the first place I looked at. Not because I liked it as honestly I did not. However I didn't want to lose my amazing chance at receiving help from flacra. Family promise helped me move into the apt, gave me furniture like beds, and sofa and chair, kitchen table, etc... Though I do not like this place I am in now, family promise has given me the strength to stay focused and know not everything has to be permanent. I will be looking for a nicer place for my kids and I. As for family promise idk where I would be if I didn't reach out to them for help. They are truly amazing. God bless them always for all they did for my family. Helping me to get back on my feet through a difficult time in my life. Leaving family promise was kinda hard to be honest. Going to miss the sweet coordinators. I honestly looked forward to the dinners they brought, not because of the food, but because of they're compassion! Makes me remember there still is good and God's beauty in this crazy world. Not to mention I received they're help the yr of 2020... Can't even imagine how scary it would be if I was still bouncing between hotels and dss. Sure way to catch covid. However family promise took my family and I in and kept us safe. I appreciate all they have done for me! Oh and don't get me started on the volunteers that helped move things into my apartment... Truly strong God's angels they were to bring heavy furniture up these crazy stairs of mine. They were wonderful and sweet through it all though I'm sure they were tired.

After graduating from high school, I entered the seminary in Poland. After six years of formation in Theological University, I was ordained to the priesthood as an Oratorian father on November 24, 1990 at the age of 26.

Before coming to the United States, I served in the Lord's vineyard as Parochial Vicar and teacher of religion in Kamianna and Cracow. I also served as Vice Superior of the Congregation of the Oratory of St. Philip Neri.

I came to the United States in 2000. Since then I have been Sacramental Minister serving our Lord in these gracious and loving communities of the Good Shepherd Catholic Community (Scipio Center, Cayuga, Union Springs, King Ferry, Aurora and Moravia,) and also in Lyons. I spent 12 years in Auburn (Sacred Heart, St. Ann, St. Francis, St. Hyacinth, Chaplain at Mercy Rehabilitation Center and Chaplain for NYS DOCCS (Department of Corrections and Community Supervision).

In 2014-2018 I served as Parochial Vicar at Our Lady of the Lakes (St. Michael - Penn Yan, St. Januarius - Naples, St. Theresa - Stanley and St.Patrick - Prattsburgh). In 2018-2019 I served in the South Rochester Catholic Community.

Lastly, in 2019-2020 I was the Chaplain at Strong, Highland and Unity Hospitals. I now hope to continue to actively provide religious services to this parish family for many years to come.

I want to mention, that I believe the first call for us all as parishioners is to the holy life of prayer. The Eucharist (Mass) is the source and summit of our lives and is the best prayer. I believe we should be well educated in the Catholic faith and develop a strong sense of community. We are called to help one another.

There are no meetings without influence. In a meeting with other people, we always leave a trace of good or bad. We are not "neutral". In any departing, we leave something of ourselves and others leave something in us. Even if you do not feel or do not see it with the naked eye. Some are good memories and some are bad memories. But every memory is a footprint left in me, that lives in my heart and mind.

Dear friends, from the depth of my heart I ask for your prayers. Please pray for me. I will be with you for better or for worse. Before coming here I asked the Lord for the grace of deep love and care for all of you. Only love makes us credible in the eyes of the world. The pagans, when they saw the first Christians acclaimed, "Look how they love one another!" and they became Christians themselves. I ask the Lord to bestow on us this gift of His love. Only then, whatever we do together will be pleasing to God and will bring Him glory. The beginnings are never easy, but I believe that with your help and prayer we will do a good job here. I hold you all in my heart and immerse each one of you in the unfathomable Mercy of God. Praised be the Lord Jesus Christ!
