Acts of Spiritual Communion

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping him in his Body and Blood. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

A prayer for Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to receive you in my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

January 17 Psalm 40 Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will.


I have waited, waited for the LORD, and he stooped toward me and heard my cry. And he put a new song into my mouth, a hymn to our God.

Advent! Christmas! Holy Family Sunday! New Year's Day (The day Jesus got His name!) Epiphany! The Baptism of the Lord! And, in a little over a month, Ash Wednesday! The Holy Season of Lent! Palm Sunday! Holy Thursday! Good Friday!

Easter! The Easter Season! Pentecost! But, come on, really? The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time? Boooring! How... ordinary.... But is it? Actually, our ordinary lives as followers of Christ are absolutely extraordinary. As we hear the readings this Sunday, we can hear the voice of God calling each one of us to an extraordinary life. Really? Most definitely. Our Heavenly Father, who loved us so much that he sent His Only Son to be our Savior, Our Lord, and our brother, has in store for us something really extraordinary. For we have been called out of a world dominated by sin into the grace-filled life of the followers of Jesus Christ. As

Samuel answered the call he received in the middle of the night and the Apostles answered the call when they heard it in the land of Israel, so too is God calling you to an extraordinary life! Think about it. We come to Mass each and Holy Day. Sunday Sometimes the church is decorated for Christmas or for Easter — poinsettias or lilies! But, at other times, the church



looks, well, ordinary. But what happens here at every Mass? The Word of God is proclaimed, prayers of praise are offered, and — a drum roll, please — the Lord Himself offers us Himself!
