**Sacrament of Reconciliation** Persevere on the journey to holiness: Say "No" to sin and "Yes" to God's love, mercy and forgiveness. St. Mary Magdalene in the Church Hall on Saturday evenings 3:30 to 4:15 PM, St. Jude's in the old Sacristy on Sunday morning from 7:20 to 7:50 AM, or please call the Parish Office to make an appointment.

**Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** Jesus continues his healing ministry through his Church. If you or any parishioner is ill at home, in the hospital or the nursing home, and desires to celebrate this sacrament of healing, call the Parish Office to schedule a visit.

#### Acts of Spiritual Communion

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping him in his Body and Blood. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

#### A prayer for Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to receive you in my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.



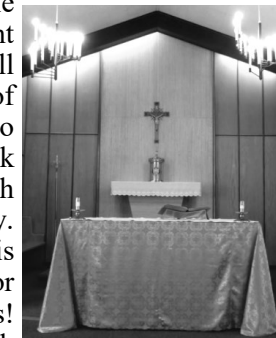




#### A Reflection from Deacon Greg

Advent! Christmas! Holy Family Sunday! New Year's Day (The day Jesus got His name!) Epiphany! The Baptism of the Lord! And, in a little over a month, Ash Wednesday! The Holy Season of Lent! Palm Sunday! Holy Thursday! Good Friday! Easter! The Easter Season! Pentecost! But, come on, really? The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time? Booring! How... *ordinary*.... But is it? Actually, our *ordinary* lives as followers of Christ are absolutely *extraordinary*. As we hear the readings this Sunday, we can hear the voice of God calling each one of us to an extraordinary life. Really? Most definitely. Our Heavenly Father, who loved us *so much* that he sent His Only Son to be our Savior, Our Lord, and *our brother*, has in store for us something really extraordinary. For we have been called out of a world dominated by sin into the grace-filled life of the followers of Jesus Christ. As Samuel answered the call he received in the middle of the night and the Apostles answered the call when they heard it in the land of Israel, so too is God calling you to an *extraordinary* life! Think about it. We come to Mass each Sunday and Holy Day. Sometimes the church is decorated for Christmas or for Easter — poinsettias or lilies! But, at other times, the church looks, well, ordinary. But what happens here at every Mass? The Word of God is proclaimed, prayers of praise are offered, and — a drum roll, please — the Lord Himself offers us *Himself!* **He offers us His Body and His Blood.** Can there be anything more extraordinary than that? I can't think of anything. What do we hear in today's Gospel? We hear that two disciples of John the Baptist followed Jesus. And "Jesus turned... and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "...where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying." Jesus, in this Ordinary Time calls you as well. There are no Christmas trees to distract us from where



Jesus is now staying. Look, there he is! On the altar, in the hands of the priest, in the Tabernacle, waiting for you, calling you, welcoming you, desiring to make your life *extraordinary*, calling you to that place where, "every tear will be wiped away" to that place where you will become like God for "you will see him as he is!" Rejoice for the Lamb of God Who takes away the sins of the world is here, with us forever!
