

1st Friday Exposition at St. Michael's in Lyons

On the First Fridays of every month, immediately following the 8:30 am Mass there is Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament followed by Benediction at 10 am.

At **St. John the Evangelist church in Clyde**, on every 1st Sunday of each month, Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament are held, with the *recitation* of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Benediction ends the services. Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament begins at 2 pm. The Divine Mercy Chaplet is *recited* at 3 pm, followed by Benediction.

On September 5th and December 5th, these devotions will be held with Confessions and with the singing of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. As in other months, the service will begin at 2 pm with Chaplet at 3 pm. Benediction ends the services.



NOVENA TO ST. ANNE

The Novena to St. Anne begins at St. John's on Saturday, July 17th at 7 pm and continues each evening through Sunday, July 25th, the eve of the Memorial of Sts. Joachim and Anne, Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. On Wednesday, July 21st the Novena will begin after the 6 pm Mass. The Rosary is recited followed by prayers to St. Anne. We hope to see you there.

Summer
It is quite hard to believe that the 4th of July holiday is already in the rearview mirror. It means that summer

is already well under way. I have often found that parish life, as well as regular life, slows down some during the summer months. Maybe it's because it's often too hot to do too much, or just because we need some time to slow down, but summer often becomes the time of year where we take time off and get away.

My guess is that many of you will try to take a vacation during these months. Vacations are very nice and are very beneficial for us, whether we go to some far-off country or stay right in our own backyard. But might I suggest, if you can this year, to consider taking some time off, not simply for leisure, but to spend with the Lord.

Every summer, as parish life slows down, I plan a week-long retreat. Now, priests are required to make a yearly retreat, but I would make it even if it wasn't required. I have always gone to the Abbey of the Genesee monastery located in Piffard, out in Livingston County. That week spent with the Trappist Monks has always been a powerful one for me. Year after year I have received so many benefits from spending just a few days there in prayer and solitude. Just being able to step away from the rigors of life for a few days and spend some much-needed quiet time with our Lord, away from technology and deadlines and schedules, has always helped to recharge my batteries. I always come back feeling refreshed and ready to take on the challenges of parish life that await me when I return.

Now, I know, of course, that not everyone is able to take a week off to spend at a secluded monastery. But if you get a chance, I would encourage you to spend some time this summer in quiet with the Lord. Spend some time away from the noise of daily life and put yourself in God's presence. Maybe make a daytrip to the Abbey, or to Mount Saviour, another Monastery down in Elmira, in the Southern Tier. Or make a trip to one of the many shrines throughout our state. You can even set up a prayer room in your house, in a quiet area, to be with the Lord. And of course, don't forget to spend some time in the Church before the Blessed Sacrament. I can promise you that, if you take that time this summer, your lives will

continued to be enriched, refreshed, and renewed.
