#### 1st Friday Exposition at St. Michael's in Lyons

On the First Fridays of every month, immediately following the 8:30 am Mass there is Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament followed by Benediction at 10 am.

At St. John the Evangelist church in Clyde, on every 1st Sunday of each month, Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament are held, with the *recitation* of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Benediction ends the services. Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament begins at 2 pm. The Divine Mercy Chaplet is *recited* at 3 pm, followed by Benediction.

On September 5th and December 5th, these devotions will be held with Confessions and with the *singing* of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. As in other months, the service will begin at 2 pm with Chaplet at 3 pm. Benediction ends the services.

This weekend we are celebrating the independence of our country, we do well to be so thankful for this country in which we live. May we wisely and generously use the gifts of freedom and abundance that God has showered upon us in loving service of others.

Jesus in today's gospel returns to his home, to those he

knows. He experiences a huge surprise. They were used to Jesus assisting Joseph in woodworking and probably speaking very little. But here they meet Jesus, who speaks of God with great eloquence, wisdom and self-confidence. In addition, he has the power that changes the lives and condition of the people. The image of Jesus as a youth was so imprinted in their minds that they were unable to see another face of Jesus who was once again in their midst. disbelief in Jesus - his task and tools - did not end 2000 years ago. It is mine and probably your frequent experience! Many of us have become accustomed to an image of Jesus from our childhood or youth, in which each of us sits on long-established positions: "This Jesus will bring nothing new to my life. I know what He requires of me, and I just have to survive until the end of my days here on earth. Maybe there will be some surprise on the other side of my life, but I'm sure not here!" This attitude of resisting the newness of Jesus is often expressed, among other attitudes by a lack of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, not reading the Holy Bible, the rare use of the sacraments (boredom and the same stuff in the Eucharist; I would have to go to the confessional with the same sins and so on). This reality works also in our human interactions: how many times do we approach our loved ones the same way! Do you believe and notice that those who have been around you for a long time (your spouse, your child, relative, neighbor, priest, co-worker...) can surprise you (not in the sense of a scandal)? Do you believe that he or she can bring God closer and reveal Him to you, and that God has endowed them with gifts showing us the power of God's transforming love? Let us ask the Lord this week for open eyes and open hearts, which will allow us to be effectively surprised by the action of God and of our fellow me Praised be the Lord Jesus Christ!!!!
