

Octave of the Nativity of Mary

We are currently in the middle of a very interesting week in terms of the liturgical calendar. Last Wednesday, September 8, we celebrated the Feast of the Nativity of Mary. While not as grand a celebration as her conception, celebrated on December 8 (9 months before September 8), this feast began to be celebrated in the Church as early as the sixth century, and it was fixed to the calendar before the Immaculate Conception.

Of course, Mary's birth is not recorded in the Scriptures. There is an account of Mary's birth in a writing called the "Protoevangelium of James", a non-canonical text that most likely reflected the early Christian's traditional beliefs of Mary's origin. Sts. Joachim and Anne, Mary's parents, had their prayers for a child answered when an angel came to them and said that they would have a daughter who would hold a very special place in salvation history.

While it is not celebrated this year because it falls on a Sunday, September 12 is the Memorial of the Most Holy Name of the Blessed Virgin Mary. On September 12, 1683, John Sobieski, King of Poland, led his army to Vienna, Austria, which was under siege from the Turkish Army. They successfully repelled the Turkish forces and saved the city of Vienna. The army march before a banner to the Blessed Virgin Mary, and Sobieski gave glory to the Lord and to Mary for the victory. In honor of this triumph, Pope Innocent XI promulgated the feast day of the Most holy name of Mary to the whole Church, and it was eventually fixed to September 12 by Pope St. Pius X in the early 20th Century.

On Tuesday, we will celebrate the most important feast day of the week, the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Tradition holds that St. Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine, went looking for the True Cross on which Christ was crucified in Jerusalem. While preparing to build a basilica over the Holy Sepulcher, three crosses were found, and St. Helena believed that one was the True Cross, while the other two were from the two thieves crucified with Jesus. The crosses were then brought to a woman who was dying, and when she touched the True Cross, she was healed. The Feast day was fixed to September 14, the day when the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher was officially dedicated. It is a day which we continue to recognize and venerate the Cross, the true instrument of our salvation.

Finally, the octave celebration of the birth of Mary ends on Wednesday, September 15, the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. It is fitting that this day is celebrated one day after the Exaltation of the Cross. The celebration of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Immaculate Heart of Mary occur on a Friday and Saturday in June (along with the First Friday/Saturday devotions throughout the year). Jesus died on the Cross and therefore won our salvation on a Friday, and Mary remained unshaken in her faith on the Saturday after the Crucifixion, even amid the sorrow she felt. Thus, while we venerate the Cross on September 14, the instrument of salvation, we remember Mary on September 15, who, in spite of the sword of sorrow that pierced her heart at the Crucifixion, remained steadfast in her faith, and understood the power of Jesus' sacrifice before anyone else.

This week gives us an opportunity to reflect on the relationship between Jesus and Mary as well as the role that each of them undertake in our salvation. Fr. Mike
