ECUMENICAL SERVICE AND A BLESSING OF THE ANIMALS

Saturday, October 9, beginning at 10 am in Lyons Park there will be an Ecumenical Service with a blessing of



animals in the tradition of Saint Francis of Assisi. Pets of any kind are welcome; we only ask that they be on leashes, if needed, and that you will clean up after them if any "accidents" occur. Father Felicjan will bless all the critters. Invite your friends and neighbors. This event is for all pet lovers.

In ancient Judaism, divorce was not associated with taking legal action in court. The husband wrote up a letter of divorce: "I am leaving and divorcing my wife from this day." he then handed it to his wife.

In the discussion on divorce, religious teachers refer to the content of chapter 24 of Deuteronomy: "If a man marries a woman and becomes her husband, but he does not favor her because he found something repulsive in her, he will write her a divorce letter, hand it to her, then send her out of his house."

Jesus refers to the description of the marriage of the first people in the Book of Genesis: "This is why a man leaves his father and his mother and joins his wife so closely that they become one flesh."

Jesus restores God's original plan, corrected in history by Moses, allowing divorce as a concession through human weakness. The revised plan failed. He allowed the husband, from the first or hundredth conflict with his wife, to think about separating from her, not about building unity with her. Disappointments and conflicts in God's plan provide an opportunity to build a better marital unit. But the human plan seeks to tear it apart.

The man who is not meant to dissolve a marriage is not a judge but a husband. In light of Moses' revised plan, only the husband could divorce his wife, the wife could not do the same to her husband. Jesus annuls the Old Testament divorce procedure.

Jesus' teaching about marriage and divorce is another challenge for those who wish to be its followers: the prohibition of divorce and remarriage.

A man who marries two women commits adultery as much as a woman who has relationships with two men. Jesus emphasizes fidelity to his first wife.

Mark, writing the Gospel for readers living in a Roman culture in which wives could divorce their husbands, points to the application of Jesus' teachings in this case as well. In ancient times, no one spoke so strongly about divorce and we see disciples ask for explanations. Fr. Felician

1st Friday Exposition at St. Michael's in Lyons

On the First Fridays of every month, immediately following the 8:30 am Mass there is Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament followed by Benediction at 10 am.

At St. John the Evangelist church in Clyde, on every 1st Sunday of each month, Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament are held, with the *recitation* of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Benediction ends the services. Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament begins at 2 pm. The Divine Mercy Chaplet is *recited* at 3 pm, followed by Benediction.

On December 5th, these devotions will be held with Confessions and with the *singing* of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. As in other months, the service will begin at 2 pm with Chaplet at 3 pm. Benediction ends the services.

Volunteer CASE Training

Thank you to all volunteers who serve our parish ministries!

As outlined in the June memo from Frs. Felicjan and Merritt to volunteers, in order to try to ensure a safe environment for children, youth and vulnerable adults, the Diocese of Rochester has implemented mandatory (CASE) training for all active volunteers (with the exception of Councils, Counters and Cleaners). After the initial training, it must be renewed every 3 years until age 70. For new volunteers, training needs to be completed before volunteer service begins.

This training is being implemented so that we can do everything we can to protect those who are most vulnerable in our communities. The training is meant to help people spot the warning signs that appear when children and vulnerable adults are in danger. Even if you are not working directly with youth or vulnerable adults, the Diocese wants as many people as possible to know those warning signs and dangers, to encourage all of us to speak out if we see something that shouldn't be happening.

Thank you to everyone who has already completed the training! If not done yet, in order to be compliant, and remain active in ministries, the training is past due and needs to be completed immediately. The parish office is compiling CASE Training Volunteer Tracking and will be contacting active volunteers who have not completed training. Please contact the parish office to discuss and/or if questions. More information is also available on the CCBT website under "Safe Environment". Your understanding of this important initiative is greatly appreciated.
