Living in Grace through the Sacraments



Advent is a season of grace when God invites us to journey deeper into his love and his presence. We as faithful disciples should confidently anticipate Jesus' coming with redeeming mercy, and prayerfully attend to Jesus' presence among us already in those who need God's mercy and our care. Let this be our Advent preoccupation: *God's mercy for us and our mercy for one another.*

Advent, taken from the Latin "advenio," meaning "to come", anticipates not only the coming of Jesus as a child, but is also to prepare Christians for the Second Coming of Christ at the end of time. This anticipatory season is filled with its own symbols as well. One of the most common symbols used in Advent is a wreath with four candles three purple and one pink (or rose), representing the four Sundays of Advent. The purple, or violet, color represents the penitential nature of Advent. Advent is also a season of penance — we don't think of that, but that's why the color is violet because it is a season of penance and preparation. Advent is also a recognition of our distance from God, still more a season of anticipation and rejoicing but there's a penitential nature to it.
