On Thursday of Holy Week, the Church remembers Christ's Last Supper and sets the scene for what will happen the next day. At the end of Mass, the liturgy re-enacts the movement of Jesus to the Garden of Gethsemane. After processing through the church, the Eucharist is placed on the side altar, representing Jesus' Agony in the Garden as he prays before his arrest and betrayal. According to ancient tradition, the faithful are invited to continue adoration before the Blessed Sacrament for a suitable length of time during the night. This tradition of adoring Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament on Holy Thursday recalls how Jesus invited his apostles to stay with him while he prayed. Listen to Jesus' words! "*My soul is very sorrowful, even unto death; remain here, and watch!*"

Jesus challenges all of us to keep watch with him for at least one hour on Holy Thursday, just as he challenged his apostles on that fateful night.

Hear the words spoken by Jesus in his Agony! *He came and found them sleeping, and he said to Peter, "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not watch one hour?" (Mark 14: 37)*

It is a challenge that comes straight from Jesus and is a powerful way to begin the remembrance of the Paschal Mystery of our salvation. Will we take up the challenge of Our Lord?
