

holding its annual Parish

Picnic at the Bay Shelter at Fair Haven Beach State Park. It's hoped that camaraderie will be on display this summer! More details will be announced in the next few months.

Today is Palm Sunday, which means we have now officially entered into Holy Week. Holy Week marks the final week of Jesus' earthly life. From his triumphal entry into Jerusalem, through his Passion, Death, and Resurrection on Easter Sunday. Holy Week, and in particular, the Triduum (Holy Thursday through Easter Sunday), are considered the holiest days of the Liturgical Year, and the liturgies on those days are different from all others.

The first few days of Holy Week are similar to the rest of Lent, although on Tuesday of Holy Week every year the Bishop celebrates the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral. Here, he blesses and consecrates the Holy Oils that we use for the various Sacraments throughout the year. If you've never been, it is worth experiencing at least once, as it truly is a wonderful celebration.

The Triduum (Latin for "three days") begins on Holy Thursday, and it is these three days that stand alone as the greatest of liturgies. In fact, the liturgies on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday really form one continuous liturgy that goes from Holy Thursday through the Easter Vigil on Saturday. Holy Thursday Mass is the commemoration of the Last Supper and the Institution of the Eucharist. We hear the story of the washing of the disciple's feet in the Gospel, and we remember that call to service (the "Mandatum") by having the priest wash the feet of parishioners. At the end of Mass on Holy Thursday, there is no dismissal, as the liturgy does not end. After the Eucharistic Procession, the tabernacle sits empty and remains empty until the Easter Vigil, a symbol of the Lord's Passion and Death.

The service on Good Friday begins and ends in silence, as it is a continuation of the liturgy that began the night before and ends the following evening. On Good Friday, we commemorate the day that Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice for us, dying on the Cross. The Good Friday service is not a Mass, as we don't consecrate the Eucharist on that day. It is the only day of the year that there is no Mass celebrated. We read the full Passion Narrative in John's Gospel, and we also have a special veneration of the Cross, a reminder that what was meant to be a device of torture and death ended up being the instrument of our salvation.

The Triduum reaches its high point on Holy Saturday night with the Easter Vigil. This is the night that we begin the celebration of Easter, the Resurrection. The Easter Vigil is the night that we formally welcome Catechumens and Candidates into the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. It is truly a night of celebration, as the sorrow of the previous days lead to the joy of Easter. The celebration of the Easter Vigil liturgy leads directly into Easter Sunday, where we continue the celebration of the Resurrection.

This whole season of Lent has ultimately been preparing us for what is to come this week. I would encourage everyone, as best you can, to immerse yourself in the upcoming liturgies. If you have never been to any or all of the Triduum liturgies, I can promise you that there is no better way to finish our Lenten journey and begin the Easter celebration than to participate in these three most mysterious but powerful days.




