
COMING Beginning on Saturday, Nov. 5th, we will host a post-Mass **COFFEE HOUR** downstairs at St. Mary Magdalene. All

Building Strong Catholic Families

Halloween has significant Catholic roots. Traditionally October 31st is known as All Hallows Eve, the vigil of All Saints Day which we celebrate on November 1st. The modern focus on the eerie or mysterious also has a Catholic aspect. "When we think of Halloween, I think we often think of ghosts and goblins, and ghoulish faces", Dr Brown said. "But even these, in the Catholic tradition, are supposed to be reminders of death and of the last things". He continued, "So just as we commemorate the feast of All Saints on November 1st, beginning with All Hallows' Eve on Halloween, we also think about and turn our minds really, to the last things: death, judgment, heaven, and hell. And really our focus should be, since we all must die and are destined to judgment, how then we to live?" (from a 2019 Vatican News article by Christopher Wells)

A Year of Coming to Know God

Faith is a gift from God, necessary for salvation and requires that we follow God's commandments and faith as summarized in the Apostles' Creed. Faith is not a blind leap. We can know God through Divine Revelation and through His creation. Unlike any other creatures, human beings are made in the image of God. 
