





Building Strong Catholic Families

Children in our culture often know very little about death, dying, and eternal life. Talk with your children about their thoughts, beliefs, maybe even their fears, about death and dying. In the Gospel this week, Jesus tells us that after we die, we will not need the same things we did when we were alive, but we will continue to have a relationship with God. You could use the example of a tree to help your children understand what Jesus tells us. When a tree is alive it needs water, soil, and sunlight. When the tree is used to make a table, a toy, or something else it has a new purpose. The tree no longer needs water, soil, or sunlight. Tell your children about your hope and faith in the resurrection of the body and eternal life with God. Pray together for those in your family who have died and conclude by praying today's Psalm.

A Year of Coming to Know God

Imagine you pick up a novel, and instead of starting at the beginning, you just open the book right in the middle, or even skip to the end and start reading. What will happen? You'll be totally lost! You won't understand anything, because you don't know what came before. You won't understand the events or the characters or the references – because you don't know the story. So how can you possibly understand what it means to be a Catholic, or a Christian, or even a human being unless you have a firm grasp on what the human story is? Understanding ourselves by understanding our story. Now the Human story before Jesus has basically three parts: First, how our original parents were first created, Second, how our original parents first sinned, Third, how God continued to reach out to humanity through his chosen representatives

LONG RANGE PLANNING FOR THE EASTERN PARISHES

Recently, a Long Range Planning Committee was brought together to begin formulating a plan for the future of our Eastern Cluster Parishes in Wayne County. The Committee is comprised of members of both the Parish Councils and Finance Councils of each of our three parishes. We are all aware that there is a shortage of priests, not only in our diocese, but throughout the country. Currently, there are 133 priests serving in the Diocese of Rochester, with 58% of those priests above the age of 70. Currently, there are just 3 men in seminary.

It is obvious that many pews are vacant on Sunday, as many people have not returned to church since Covid affected all of our lives. The result of the decrease in attendance is a direct impact on the financial health of the parishes.

We may soon be faced with the reality of only one priest to serve our cluster. How will that be facilitated so that he can best serve the people he shepherds? We must have a plan in place if that should happen. The committee will be considering many facets of parish life, including cost saving measures to ensure long range financial viability. We will keep you updated on our Long Range Planning as it progresses. Please keep us in your prayers.
