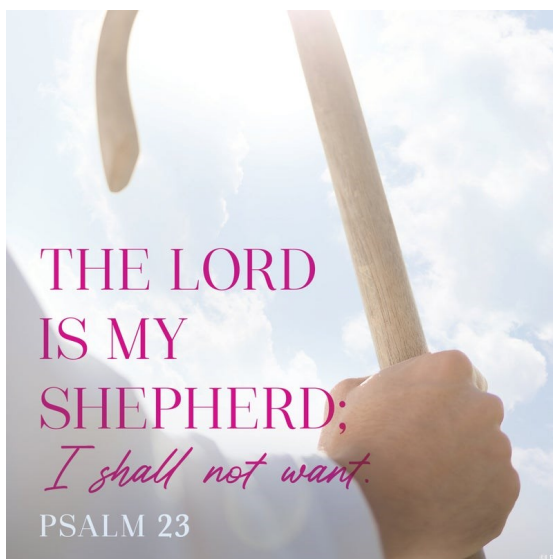


Saint of the week

**Building Strong Catholic Families**

Even though we have less experience with sheep and shepherds today in our society, we can still identify strongly with the image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd and as the gate for the sheep. Psalm 23 remains a popular and favorite psalm for prayer. In the image of the Good Shepherd, we know ourselves to be protected and cared for by a loving God. As your family gathers, ask what each person knows about sheep and shepherds. Recall that shepherds and sheep have a close relationship. Sheep will only follow their own shepherd; they recognize his voice and will not follow a stranger. The shepherd's job is to protect his sheep. In some ways, the relationship between the shepherd and his sheep is like that of a parent and child. Talk about how Jesus tells us that he is the gate for the sheep. The sheep enter the protection of the sheepfold through the gate. In Jesus we find protection and abundant life. Conclude by thanking Jesus for being our Good Shepherd and by praying today's psalm, Psalm 23

**A Year of Coming to Know God**

The Church on Earth is sometimes called the "Church Militant," because we're still fighting the good fight for Christ – still engaged in the struggle against sin and evil. But here's an important question: How do we know which Church is the real Church that Jesus founded? After all, there are a lot of denominations to choose from! Well, the Nicene Creed gives us Four Marks, four characteristics, by which we can know Christ's true Church. These marks are One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic. Also, you can see all these characteristics at the very beginning of the Church's life, at Pentecost.
