MAY 7, 2023 5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER



The scene in today's Gospel is the Last Supper. "Jesus said to Philip, "Have I been with you for so long a time, and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you not believe that I am in the

Father and the Father is in me?"

In these words, Jesus is telling Philip something that we as Christians believe to be at the heart of our faith, namely, that everything that God is has been given to us in the person of Jesus.

All of God's power and might, all of God's goodness and glory, all of God's compassion and love is totally present in Jesus Christ.

Mary gave birth to God in human form in the stable in Bethlehem. God became completely available to us in the person of Jesus.

That doctrine of our faith that we refer to as the Incarnation says that God has entered the human condition in Jesus, that God has become flesh and dwelled among us, that God is Emmanuel, a name that means God with us. All of this is why Jesus can say to Philip, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father."

Let's go back to our questions above. *How well can I know God? As well as I can know Jesus in all of his love, his kindness, gentleness, forgiveness, patience, compassion and his desire to feed and provide for everyone, qualities that are all so beautifully human. How close do I believe I am to God or how close is God to me?*

I am close to God and God is close to me every time I have the impulse to do what Jesus did, namely, to reach out to the needs of others with those same beautiful human gestures of love.

I can have a relationship with God because God has become one of us in Christ and the humanity of Christ is the model for my own becoming more human every day. My relationship with God in Christ defines who I am and the meaning and purpose of my life. The community that we call Church is meant to be the instrument for fostering and understanding this relationship with God. The sacraments, the prayer life, the teaching, and the practice of charity that make up Church life are all so important because they are the instruments by which we can see Christ and, in so doing, have a relationship with our loving God. For whenever we see Christ, we see the Father. *Laudetur Jesus Christus!*

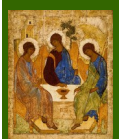

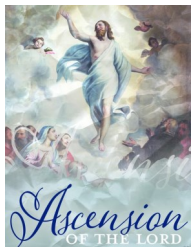

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

If you had to summarize the essential core of the Christian life, what would it be? Mercy, truth, or love, perhaps? The readings today suggest another word which may surprise you. That word is *priesthood*.

St. Peter says to us, **"You are a 'chosen race, a royal priesthood..."** To be part of a priesthood is to offer a particular sacrifice in order for the community to survive and thrive. Jesus is the great high priest because he offers the one perfect sacrifice which heals and perfects the entire human race. Peter the Apostle wants us to know that all the baptized share in this priestly ministry. The whole of our lives, including every detail, is meant to become our acceptable offering to God.

The baptized exercise this priesthood in many ways, I'll mention three. At Sunday Mass, in private prayer, and in daily work. At Mass, we offer the sacrifice of our lives with that of the priest, who symbolizes Christ the Priest. In our prayer, a "morning offering" prayer is a great way to offer up all the joys and sufferings of the day to come. In our daily work, we sacrifice our time, comfort, money, and energy to do good for others. All this gives the deepest possible meaning to our lives: we share in the priesthood which saves the world. That's at the core of our faith.

Building Strong Catholic Families

Members of the same family often bear close resemblances to one another. Sometimes physical resemblances are shared within a family, but often the similarities are behavioral characteristics and mannerisms. We hear this observation affirmed through a number of common phrases: “He’s a chip off the old block” or “She’s her mother’s daughter.” Today’s Gospel points to a mystery of faith that might be examined in light of these familial relationships. In Jesus we see and know the Father. Likewise, the Father is known through the life and work of the Son, Jesus. What does Jesus tell his disciples about his relationship with the Father? The relationship between the Father and Jesus is so close that Jesus says that those who have seen and known Jesus have also seen and known the Father. Jesus promises his disciples that because of their faith in him and in the Father, they too will be able to do the work of the Father as Jesus did. End your discussion by praying together that others will recognize in your family the work of the Father. Pray together the Lord’s Prayer.

A Year of Coming to Know God

The four marks of the church:

1. One: This means that the Church must be unified. At Pentecost we read that “They were all together and had all things in common” (Acts 2:44).
2. Holy: At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit made the Church Holy through the sacraments of Baptism (Acts 2:41) and the Eucharist (“breaking the bread” in Acts 2:42,46).
3. Catholic (=universal): At Pentecost, there are “men from every nation under heaven” (Acts 2:5), and the Church preaches to each in their own language.
4. Apostolic: At Pentecost, Peter speaks authoritatively, with the other apostles surrounding him (Acts 2:14-14).

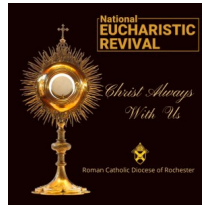

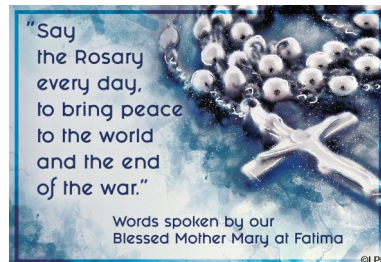
