"God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him would not perish but have eternal life."

This passage speaks strongly. God loved the world and remained faithful in his love to the end. In the beginning, everything God created was good and beautiful. Ugliness and sin have entered the world through the perverse devil and iniquity of the first people who, in exchange for the promise of divinity, have shown God infidelity. But God, even after sin, did not cease to

love the world he had created, but he had made efforts to turn the fallen and draw them to himself again. In many ways he spoke and exhorted fallen humanity until he finally spoke most strongly through his Son. In his Son, the Father has declared His love most, and everyone who accepts the Son has the Father's love within himself. The Holy Spirit, who is love, then begins to act and sanctify the sin nature of man.

It is said that St. Augustine was at a beach meditating on the mystery of the Holy Trinity, when he noticed a boy who brought water in a little shell and emptied into a hole he had made in the sand, doing this repeatedly. The Saint asked him what he was doing, to which the boy replied that his intention was to put all the water from that ocean in the sand hole. St. Augustine said that was impossible. To which the child replied that it was more impossible to understand the mystery of the Holy Trinity. It is difficult to understand how God is one and yet manifests as three different people. It is something that definitely can not be understood. What we do know is that God is of unlimited love. He is so great that He has manifested before us as the Creator of all because His love manifests by creating. He created us according to his image and likeness, to love so that we respond freely.



Today, when we celebrate the Solemnity of the Trinity, let us remember that in Jesus we were saved, that the Father gave us the Son and the Spirit so that we may share in a wonderful communion with the perfect communion of God. For each of us

there is a place at the table of God, none of us is excluded. Only at this table can we feel truly ourselves, regain peace and feel at home. May God in the Holy Trinity be glorified. Laudetur Jesus Christus!






