My friends, it is with a heavy heart that I must bid you all farewell, as I have been officially reassigned from the Eastern Wayne County Catholic Community and will now be serving the cluster parishes of St. Joseph Church in Penfield and Church of the Holy Spirit Parish in Webster. As I mentioned when I spoke at the Masses, this change in assignment was unexpected, but it comes because of unforeseen pastoral issues elsewhere in the Diocese.

It doesn't really feel like it has been three years since I first got here; the time really has gone by extremely fast. These last three years have been difficult ones for all of us. When I first arrived here in Eastern Wayne County, we had just reopened the Churches coming off of the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic in March of 2020. As I said at Mass, for the first year plus, I hardly got to know anybody because everyone had to wear masks while at Mass.

A lot has changed in these past three years. All three of our parishes look quite different than they did before the pandemic. However, it is because of all of you, that we have been able to help our Parishes grow again, with Mass attendance getting closer to normal, parish activities increasing, and our important ministries being restored. It has been a wonderful blessing getting the chance to work with all of you through these many challenges over the past couple of years.


I cannot thank all the people here who I need to thank by name, but I am so grateful for all the support that I have received during my time here, from the staff at all the Churches as well as parishioners. Even from the beginning, you have all made me feel welcome, and your hospitality to me will not be forgotten.

I am heading into a new and quite different experience in my next assignment. From many Churches to only two. From a large geographic area to a small one. From small, rural parishes to large, suburban parishes. But I know that Christ will be always before me, and I know that your love and your prayers will accompany me, and for that, I am forever grateful. Thank you all, and may God bless you and keep you, now and always.

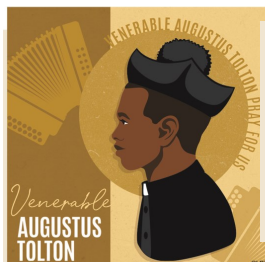

Gospel Meditation *Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture*



Do you ever feel restless? I certainly do. Daily tasks and challenges, but also the more basic demand of simply existing – sooner or later, those can all feel crushing and tire us out.

Which is why Jesus' words are such stunningly good news: "Come to me all you who labor and are burdened and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). How vastly weird that this man speaks as though he is capable of giving us the deep repose we desire. Is his claim the height of absurd grandiosity? No,

because next he immediately proclaims that he is "meek and humble of heart." We here touch a mystery: Jesus is capable of giving us rest because he is the one who forever reposes in the heart of God the Father. He is "yoked" to the Father in his divinity. But he is humbly "yoked" to us, sharing in our humanity.

The good news, my fellow tired-out friends: we don't have to despair in our burdens and exhaustion, no matter how heavy they feel. This week, join me in opening our hearts to hear him say to us, "Come! I will give you rest." We come to him in the Church, Eucharist, the Scriptures, prayer, in the poor. There he will give us rest.

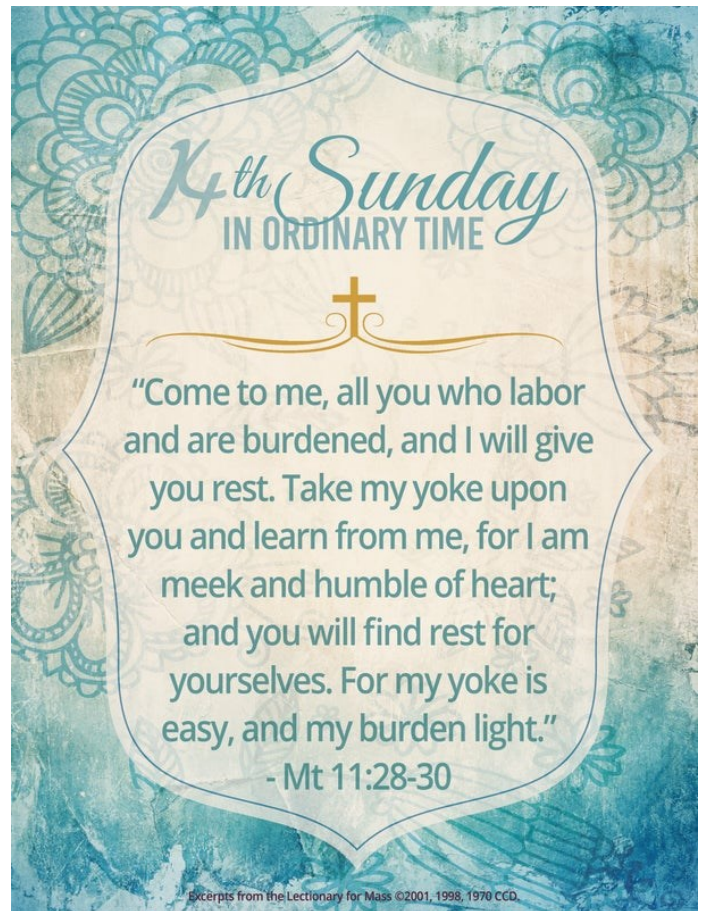

If you Google Search recommendations on how to raise generous children, almost every list of ideas begins with — or at least contains — the directive for adults to be good models of generosity themselves. 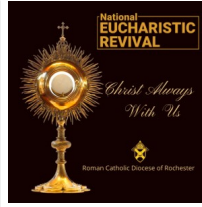
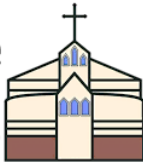

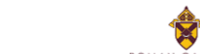
