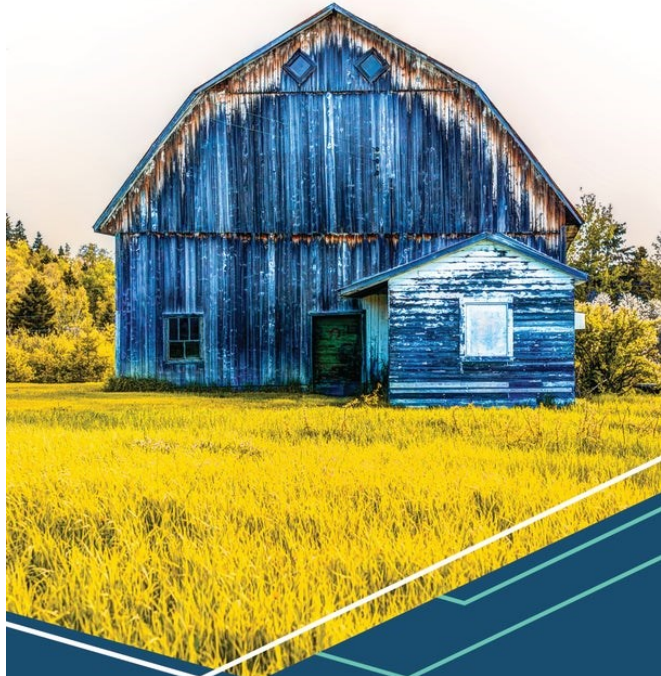

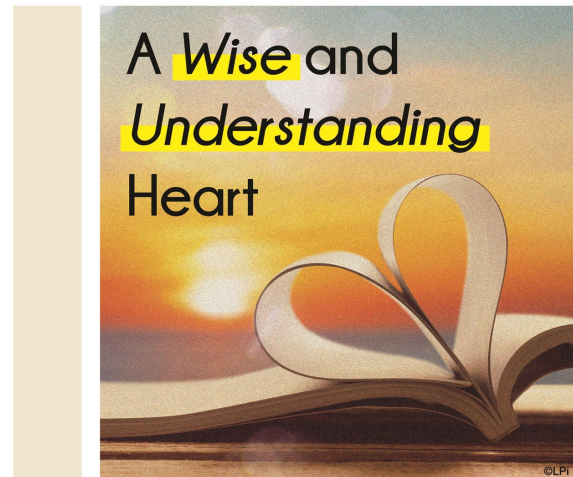

Gospel Meditation
Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Our culture seems more polarized and divided than ever. Into this wounded situation, our Catholic faith has a healing remedy to offer: the gift of wisdom. When the Lord offers to give King Solomon anything the monarch desires, he requests "an understanding heart" (1 Kings 3:9). In his polarized situation, the King doesn't ask for power to defeat his enemies. He asks for a wise and understanding heart to judge right from wrong. This wisdom is elevated and fulfilled in Jesus who teaches us to bring forth "both the new and the old" (Matthew 13:52).

In our fractured society, we Christians should stop pining for political power to crush our perceived enemies. That often just makes things worse. Rather, it's much more useful to beg for the grace of true wisdom which transcends both sides of the aisle. This places us in a fresh position from which we can help our culture see what is true and good all across the ideological spectrum. Sometimes we'll look like liberals (e.g., in our love for the poor and marginalized) and other times like conservatives (e.g., in our sexual ethics and views on religious freedom). Because this wisdom is free from ideological narrowness, it will help to heal these painful fractures. Lord Jesus, this week, pour into us your healing wisdom.

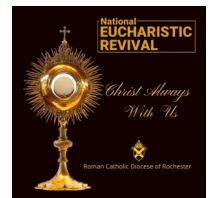

The Mass is sometimes referred to as the Eucharistic Liturgy. The word Eucharist comes from the Greek eucharistein meaning thanksgiving, and the word liturgy comes from the Greek word leitourgia meaning public worship. Several terms describe this essen-

tial and vital part of Catholic worship and belief: **Breaking of the Bread, Divine Liturgy, Eucharistic Liturgy, Holy Eucharist, Holy Mass, Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and Lord's Supper.** The phrase Sacrifice of the Mass may appear as though Catholics are trying to add the one sacrifice of Christ on the cross on the original Good Friday, but the Sacrifice of the Mass isn't separate from the sacrifice that Christ offered on Calvary in A.D. 33. It's the same sacrifice re-presented (not represented) to us in an unbloody matter. Being God, Jesus' sacrifice on the cross isn't limited to space and time as it would be if he were only human. His divinity made his sacrifice eternal. It's not that his sacrifice 2,000 years ago wasn't good enough. Rather, it was so perfect and powerful that it can never be ended or repeated. It's eternal because sins are still being forgiven even two millennia after his death. Praise be to God through our Lord Jesus Christ! Fr. Felician

Like the person who found the buried treasure and the merchant who acquired the pearl of great price, we seek to find the signs of the kingdom of heaven in our lives. Place this list before you as you read today's Gospel in its shorter form, Matthew 13:44-46. In these parables, Jesus teaches us that it is worth giving up even valuable things in order to possess the kingdom of heaven. Look at the list your family made and talk about how these things are important to the kingdom of heaven. What has your family given up to make these values important in your life? As Jesus' disciples, we place everything we value in the service of the pursuit of the Kingdom of God. Pray together for God's kingdom by praying the Lord's Prayer.
