The Transfiguration of the Lord

The Evangelists talk about this event, and even St. Peter, an eyewitness, describes them in his letter. Only the Apostles chosen by Jesus survived them. On the mountain, a secret was revealed to them, which the other disciples learned about only after the resurrection. On August 6, the Church celebrates the feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. Together with Peter, James and John,

we stand on Mount Tabor to see the face of Jesus shining like the sun, his garments dazzling white, and we want to be witnesses of theophany, the revelation of God, his glory.

What a grace for Peter, James, and John to see Jesus transfigured. They got a preview of the glory of Jesus risen from the dead and his glory in heaven. It was also a preview of the glory we all hope to share in heaven. This was a very special grace for Peter, James, and John.

The Father said, "Listen to him." In other words, "Do not be scandalized at the teaching of my son Jesus about his forthcoming Passion, death, and resurrection."

Will they listen to Jesus? Will they stand by Jesus as he goes to his Passion and death?

We know the story. Peter denied Jesus in the courtyard of the high priest, and James, like the rest of the disciples, abandoned Jesus. Only John listened to Jesus and was not scandalized by the passion and death of Jesus.

Why should we be disappointed with them because we also have experienced and met Jesus in many ways and sometimes we too let him down?

- We meet Jesus in a most intimate way every time we receive Jesus in the Eucharist. It is the time when we are close to Jesus.
- We meet Jesus in the Scriptures as they touch our hearts. Jesus speaks to us now when we read the Scriptures. The Scriptures are not just about the life of Jesus; in the Scriptures Jesus also speaks to us about our lives and in the we meet Jesus as he speaks to us about our lives.
- We meet Jesus in a very special way in all the Sacraments.
- We have seen Jesus in great people like Pope John Paul II and Mother Teresa.

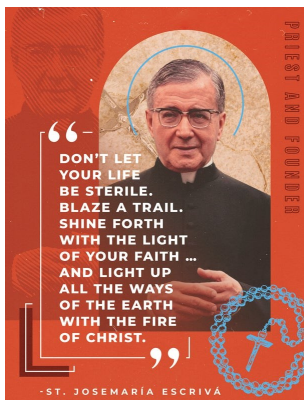

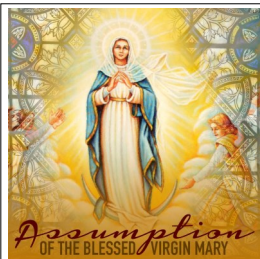

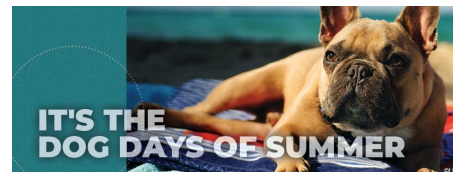

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

What is Christianity finally about? These days if you ask almost anyone who doesn't know the Bible you'll probably hear an answer like this: "Being a good person" or "following the golden rule." No offense to the golden rule, but our faith is simply much stranger than that. This week's feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is a luminous example of this. Jesus becomes radiantly and overwhelmingly beautiful. The glory of God literally shines forth from his body and even his clothes. Here we see that Christianity is not mainly a moral system, but a relationship with God in Christ, one that finally makes human beings gloriously beautiful.

Now we can see our good and bad deeds in a new and de-centered way. Our morality isn't about a heaven or hell scorecard. It's about lives open (or closed) to transfiguration, lives capable of revealing the glory of God in Christ to the world. Spouses, children, friends, co-workers, priests, consecrated women and men, and so on — we are all called to let the beauty of Jesus make our lives beautiful, little by little. His beauty in us is the center of our faith.

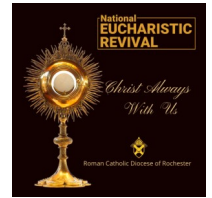


"I am the bread of life." John 6:51



The Mass is the Sacred rite - the formal, official worship service of Catholicism. It incorporates the Bible (Sacred Scripture), prayer, sacrifice, hymns, symbols, gestures, sacred food for the soul, and directions on how to live a Catholic life - all this in one ceremony. **The Mass, being the supreme act of worship, is the only way that a Catholic can fulfill the Third Commandment to keep holy the Sabbath day.** Even though the Jewish Sabbath is Saturday, the Last Supper took place on Holy Thursday, and Jesus died on Good Friday, the main focus of Christianity is that Christ rose from the dead on the first Easter Sunday. Therefore, Sunday is the Christian Sabbath. It's the day that Catholic Christians go to church to participate in the Mass. Fr. Felician

Every family has special moments that they remember and share. In sharing these stories, the meaning and importance of the events develops and deepens over time. This is how it was with the disciples' remembrance of Jesus' Transfiguration. The full significance of what they had seen and experienced could only be understood after Jesus' Death and Resurrection. As Peter, James, and John reflected on the event and told other believers about the Transfiguration, their own faith deepened. Because Matthew, Mark, and Luke recorded the account of the Transfiguration in their writings, we too can deepen our faith in Jesus, the Son of God and our Savior.

Gather as a family and think about some special memories that your family recalls over and over again. Talk about why these moments are important to you. Remember that in the Bible we find many important stories about Jesus. They have been recorded so that we too can learn about him and his teachings, so that we too can come to know and love Jesus, God's beloved Son. Read today's Gospel, Matthew 17:1-9. Discuss as a family how Jesus fulfills the promises that God made to Israel and how God glorified Jesus after the Resurrection. Talk about your family and the promises you have made to one another. Conclude by praying together the Lord's Prayer so that as a family you continue to grow in faithfulness to one another and to your heavenly Father.
