In this Sunday's second reading from the Fourth Chapter of Paul's letter to the Philippians, it is tempting to think that Paul is writing directly to us and our times instead of to a faith community two thousand years ago. In his letter Paul acknowledged a general anxiety that was felt by the people of that community. And when reading this letter I could not help but think about the palpable anxiety that seems to permeate our modern society as well, especially in our younger generations.

According to a recent poll taken by the United States Census Bureau, 49.9% of young adults between the ages of eighteen and twenty-four reported symptoms of anxiety and/or depressive disorder. And this anxiety was not exclusive only to that generation. The same study showed that 90% of the population in general has felt an increase in anxiety and depression over the past few years. So what can we do as followers of Christ in the face of such anxiety and depression?

In his letter to the Philippians Saint Paul suggests that we should find trust in the peace of God; the God who surpasses and is above all of those concerns that keep us awake at night. He says that instead of focusing on our fears and worries we should instead focus on the good gifts of God, the things that are true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, and gracious. He suggests that we place all our concerns into His hands and live without anxiety or fear.

Saint Padre Pio said these encouraging words that seem tailored to our times. He said, "pray, hope, and don't worry. Worry is useless. God is merciful and will hear your prayer. Prayer is the best weapon we have; it is the key to God's heart."

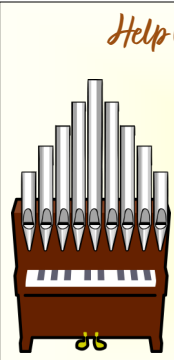

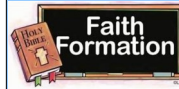

The Gift that Gives Back

It never ceases to amaze me how often I fall into the trap and end up grumbling about the greatest gifts in my life. A husband, children, a life that is full almost to bursting: these are things for which I once begged God. These are the jewels in the crown of my life.

Oh, but the children need care. Constant care. And a husband — a real flesh-and-blood creation of God, entrusted to me by God, to help me be holy and relying on me for holiness in turn — well, that relationship is a lot of work, isn't it? And a "full life" — I laugh to think of it, and then I blush with shame, because I admit sometimes, I do yearn for a life that is a little less ... full. A full life can leave you awfully tired at the end of the day.

I would imagine it's the same for everyone, no matter your life circumstances or vocation. Your greatest blessings are also those things that require much of you, more than you imagined you would ever be asked to give. The biggest jewels make the crown heavy.

But if we had any of these gifts without the effort it takes to maintain them, would they be half as sweet?

In this same way, the work of the vineyard is opened to us through baptism; we are given the chance to produce fruit for the kingdom. It's a chance we never dared to dream would be given to us.

It's a gift. But just like with any gift worth having, it requires effort. Upkeep. Work.

It requires that we give in return. And it's the giving that somehow, mystically, transforms us. It's the giving that turns into the gift itself.

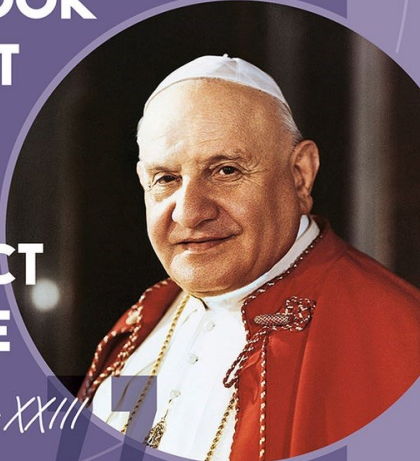

In an ideal household, family members know the rules and follow them consistently. Even the most conscientious among us, however, sometimes needs to be reminded of the rules and their importance. How we respond to such correction reveals our true character. In today's Gospel Jesus exposes the religious leaders for their failure to heed God's messengers. It is an opportunity for us to consider how we respond to those who are God's messengers today, calling us to correct our ways and return to the way of the Lord.

As you gather as a family, talk about some of the most important rules of your household. Consider how consistently family members follow these rules. How are family members reminded when rules are not being followed? How do they respond? In today's Gospel Jesus corrects the religious leaders through a parable telling them that they have not heeded God's messengers.

Read Matthew 21:33-43. What are some of God's rules that we must follow? How do we respond to God's messengers today? Pray together as a family that you will heed God's messengers and follow God's ways. Pray together the Act of Contrition for the times when your family has not heeded God's word.

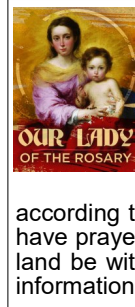
Traditionally, Catholicism has four kinds of prayer: Adoration: Praising God Contrition: Asking for God's forgiveness Petition: Asking God for a favor Thanksgiving: Showing God gratitude **The Church believes that the Mass is the highest and supreme form of prayer**, so it has all four elements in it. **The Gloria is the adoration part of prayer**, whereas the Confiteor and Penitential Rite are the contrition part. Later in the Mass, after the homily and the Nicene Creed comes the Prayer of the Faithful, also known as the General Intercessions, or sometimes Universal Prayer, which is a prayer of petition. **The thanksgiving part** comes after Holy Communion, when gratitude is shown for all the graces given at Mass, especially in the Prayer after Communion offered for us all by the Priest.
