“The greatest among you must be your servant.” Mt. 23.13
 This Sunday’s gospel repeats the all-too-familiar words *“Whoever humbles himself shall be exalted.”* We sometimes have some strange definitions of the words *“proud”* and *“humble.”* For many, *“humble”* might mean submitting to others, or even to disliking oneself but if you google *“humility,”* you can find some pretty good quotations from famous people , e.g. *“A great man (we should add “woman”) is always willing to be little.”* / Ralph Waldo Emerson/

When Jesus tells his followers to be humble, he is not saying that they should hide their talents, but to be grateful for them. He is not telling them they should think less of themselves, but maybe to be thinking of themselves less often. And he is telling them not to fret when their talents are not recognized, and not to complain when no one praises them for the good they have done. Humility is the nearly impossible task of being more aware of our own failings than we are with those of others.

Finally, Mother Teresa of Calcutta, undoubtedly one of the most humble, compassionate public figures we have had the gift of knowing, wrote these words about humility. These are a few of the ways we can practice humility:

- To speak as little as possible of one’s self.
- To mind one’s own business.
- To accept contradictions and correction cheerfully.
- To pass over the mistakes of others.
- To accept insults and injuries.
- To accept being slighted, forgotten and even disliked.
- To be kind and gentle even under provocation.
- Never to stand on one’s dignity.
- To choose always the hardest.

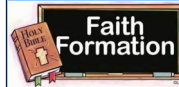

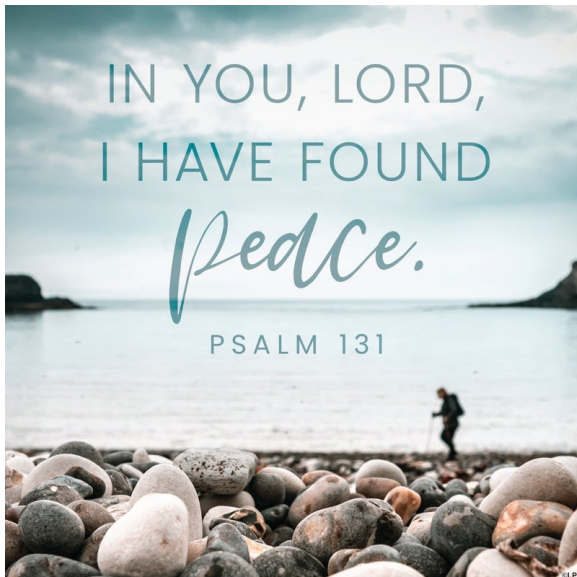

Family "Do as I say, not as I do." How many of us have been tempted to say this to our children? In today's Gospel we hear a resounding reply from Jesus, "Practice what you preach." Those who know us best, our family and especially our children, can identify the inconsistencies between what we want to teach and the example that we give. The challenge for all of us, especially for those of us who are parents, is to model with consistency the faith and the Christian way of life we wish to teach our children. As you gather as a family, talk about what it means to practice what you preach. Identify some examples of people you know who practice what they preach. What do you observe about these people? What do you admire about them? In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus talk about the importance of acting in ways that are consistent with our faith. Read together today's Gospel, Matthew 23:1-12. Talk together about ways in which your family might better practice the faith that you profess. Choose one action to take that will show your faith in action. Pray together that your family's faith will be shown consistently in your actions. Pray the Prayer for Vocations.



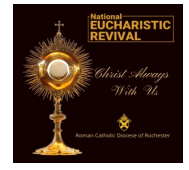

The Church chooses the Sacred texts to be read during a specific Mass; it isn't up to the priest or Deacon. Each Sunday, the readings follow a **three-year cycle (A, B, and C)**; the Gospels of Mathew, Mark and Luke take precedence, with the Gospel of John sprinkled in during various times of the year. Currently we are in cycle **A**, the Gospel of Mathew. After three years, if you go to Mass every Sunday, you have heard and been exposed to all four Gospels as well as most of the New Testament writings and Epistles. But the readings at the weekday Mass (Monday through Saturday morning) work a little differently. **The weekday Mass uses a two-year cycle (I and II)**, because only two readings are done during the week, versus the three on the weekend. All even numbered years (2022, 2024, etc) are year II for daily biblical Mass readings. Currently we are in cycle I.
