Come to Mass!

It's easy to think and to say that Mass begins at 8:00 or at 10:30. We even say things like, "I go to the 4:00 o'clock." Those are some times for Mass but is that when our worship begins? Nope! There's so much more. Let's ask ourselves, "what is our first act of worship." If you answer that it's when Mass begins, *well, you're wrong!* The first act of worship begins at home when we stir ourselves out of our rest and get going. The Holy Spirit calls us to worship and we decide to answer. We get moving, we set aside our activities, we stir our feet and get to Mass. And then we walk into church. People are gathering — an act of worship! — and we greet our fellow believers. Dipping our hand into the holy water, we make the Sign of the Cross, reminding ourselves that it was through Baptism that we first entered the Church. We look forward and see the Tabernacle and we realize that Jesus is there! We move to our chosen pew and genuflect toward the presence of Christ. Now it is time when we offer all our prayer, works, joys, and sufferings to the only One who came to earth to share in our life, to live for us, and to die for us so that we might live forever. Our decision to worship, our moving ourselves to actually get to church, our entering the building, our bodily posture, our time of prayer, our gathering, all of this is worship. Even our getting dressed and putting something in the envelope are acts of worship. I remember the sisters in school saying to us that God has given us everything and it is not much to give Him and hour of our time on Sunday. Years ago, one of our most dedicated parishioners said something I'll never forget: "When I come to Mass, I'm tired, worn out from the week of work and activities. And then, I place all of my cares and concerns on the altar to be offered up. And, when Mass is over and I have received the Body of Christ, I am renewed and ready to face life again." Hear the words of Jesus, ***"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest."***

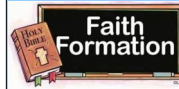

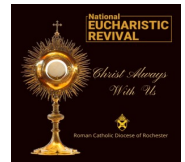

At Mass, the congregation doesn't need to bring a Bible and follow along, because the priest, deacon, and lector read aloud from the Lectionary - a book that meets the specific needs of the Catholic Mass. The Lectionary only contains biblical readings, but they are arranged in a different order than the Bible. The Bible begins with Genesis and ends with Revelation. The lectionary, however, begins with the Scripture readings for the first Sunday of the **new church calendar year, in Advent, and ends on the last Sunday of Ordinary Time, when we celebrate Christ The King.** The Lectionary lists the readings for the first Sunday of Year A - an Old Testament reading, a Psalm, a New Testament Epistle, and a Gospel - followed by the readings for the first Sunday of liturgical year B and then Year C. The readings for the second Sunday of Year A, B, and C then follow the readings for the first Sunday, and so on. The Lectionary is nothing more than the Bible selections put together in such a way so that the person reading the Sacred Scriptures only has to read one- or two-pages side by side instead of going back and forth from one end of the Bible to the other, trying to find the chapter and verse needed. The Lectionary conveniently organizes the Scripture readings Sunday-by-Sunday and weekday-by-weekday.
