

## **JUNE 2, 2024**



Today, in the Church we celebrate the feast of the Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. It all began in 1246, when Bishop Robert of Thourotte († 1246) set up this feast for the diocese of Liège, or rather a few years earlier from the visits of Saint.

We proclaim that the Lord Jesus is truly, really and substantially present under the forms of bread and wine. His presence is not a metaphor or symbolic language but a reality. Over time, this truth led to the practice of Eucharistic adoration – spending time before the reserved sacrament (the Eucharist in the tabernacle) in prayer, praise, silent listening, and adoration. This practice has nourished the faith and hope in and love of the Lord Jesus for countless Catholics over the centuries down to this present moment. The Church also proclaims the Eucharist to be a true sacrifice. The sacrifice of Christ is expressed through the surrender of His Body and Blood - on the cross and on the altar – for suffering and sinful humanity. But this sacrifice is also meant to include the whole

Christian life as well. We who partake of the Body and Blood agree to participate in His sacrifice. The Eucharist graces us to life characterized by dying to sin and selfishness and letting the Lord reach out to a world hungering for mercy and justice through us. As it cost Jesus to bring salvation, it costs us to deny our very selves, take up our cross and follow in His footsteps. Adoration and self-giving love and service mutually sustain each other. God testifies to love Saint John Vianney, the Curé of Ars, once came upon a workingman sitting before the tabernacle. The poor man certainly had other places to be and other pressing matters to attend to, so naturally the priest was curious as to why he lingered in church so long. "What are you doing?" Father John asked at last. The man simply glanced back to the tabernacle and said, "I look at Him. He looks at me."



## Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

The best way to understand the Eucharist is to recall God's long, careful teaching process beginning in the Old Testament. This week in Exodus 24, we learn the basic pattern. Moses reads the dictates of God's law to the people, who profess their allegiance to it. Then Moses takes representatives of Israel's twelve tribes and splashes the sacrificed blood of animals in two directions: on the altar and on the people. It's clear and serious business: clear, because the participants are entering a blood-bond with God Himself; serious, because the dead animals symbolize the life-and-death stakes at play.

Many centuries later, God uses the experience at Sinai to teach us something new. At the Last Supper, like a new Moses, Jesus proposes to "pour out" blood as a new covenant. It will land on the altar of the cross and the lips of his disciples. They have promised to be obedient to him who is God's law in flesh. This renews and elevates the breath-taking romance God wants with His people, unfolding from Sinai to this Supper. The Body and Blood of Christ is the sacrificial action whereby this covenant is strengthened.

How hopeful that, like us, the Israelites and the apostles repeatedly fail to live up to their promises and discover that the blood of the covenant continually renews and refreshes them. Today the blood of Christ faithfully flows, to unite and renew, moving us forward toward where our great teacher is taking us. This week, we should say a renewed "amen" to God who so carefully teaches us how to be one with Him in this new covenant.






