

And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!"—that is, "Be opened!" - Mk 7:32-34

Ephphatha

Try to pronounce that strange word we he heard Jesus say in the Gospel this Sunday: *Ephphatha*. This word belongs to the Aramaic language. Aramaic was the common Galilean language spoken in Judea in the time of Christ. Latin, Koine Greek, and Hebrew were understood to a greater or lesser extent there, but the common language spoken by locals, families, friends, and businesses in Christ's earthly time and place was most likely Aramaic. And the Aramaic word, Ephphatha, means "be opened."

Yet that word, *Ephphatha*, that we hear in the Gospel today is so important that it was not left in the Biblical narrative two-thousand years ago. It still shows up today in our modern liturgy in the Baptismal Rite. If you open a liturgical book that contains the Rite of Baptism you will find that word in a heading at the end of the rite. In that part of the Baptismal Rite the Celebrant touches and blesses the ears and the mouth of the person being baptized says an *Ephphatha*. He says in the rite:

"The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the mute speak. May he soon touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of God the Father."

My questions for us: Can we remember this of our own Baptism and try to live it, to spiritually recall the Ephphathat that was given to us at our Baptism just like the man in the Gospel today? Can we let the Lord touch not only our ears and mouths, but our hearts as well?




