## NOVEMBER 17, 2024

Beloved in Christ, this Sunday is the second to last Sunday of our liturgical year. As we approach the end of the church year, our gospel invites us to consider Jesus’ predictions and teaching about the end time of the world. In the context of Mark’s gospel, Jesus’ words about this are spoken to his disciples as he prepares them for his passion and death.

In today’s gospel, Jesus continues this teaching by offering his disciples signs to look for that will indicate that the coming of the Son of Man is near. His words and imagery draw upon Old Testament imagery, especially images found in the Book of Daniel. Next, Jesus offers the lesson of the fig tree, a parable that teaches that if one knows how to read the signs, one can be prepared for the end times.

Jesus also teaches, however, that no one knows when the end time will come, except the Father. In the verses that follow this reading in Mark’s gospel, Jesus continues to warn his disciples to be on watch for this end time.

Jesus’ words are not spoken to frighten his disciples, nor should they frighten us. Rather, they are offered to prepare us for the changes we will experience during our lifetimes and at the end times. Our consolation and hope is found in the lasting nature of Jesus’ words and God’s never-ending love for us.

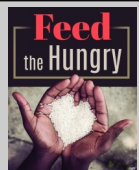

I recently moved into a new neighborhood. On my first evening I went grocery shopping and could not find my usual favorite Greek yogurt. Strangely, my heart started to race. All the losses of my previous life hit me. So many of my old friends, habits, comforts, and predictable experiences had fallen away. There I stood, a grown man, crying like a little boy whose world was falling apart in the dairy aisle.

This week, Jesus describes what to do when one world ends, and another begins. Does it apply to the end of time? Yes. Does it apply to the end of our individual lives? Yes. It also applies to every "world" we inhabit throughout our lives, in school, family, friendships, work, play and so on. First, the sun, moon, and stars fall. The old, familiar ways of running things suddenly stop working. Light fades. Things fall apart. It's awful. But, second, Christ comes **"in the clouds."** Jesus, the Son of Man, replaces those old powers with himself as the prime governing principle. Third, he sends out his angels to **"gather his elect from the four winds."** He re-integrates the fragments into a new integrated whole. **"Summer is near,"** he concludes. A new world begins.

Is your world crumbling? Are your sun, moon, and stars falling from the sky? Learn to discern the pattern of the Cross and Resurrection at work in it. This is the power we touch in the Mass. Jesus is coming precisely in this transition from the old to the new world. It doesn't make our losses easy. But it does make it possible to glimpse the dawning of a summer, a new beginning, the life of the world to come.

As we approach the end of year, we wanted to offer an opportunity to stretch your giving to your parish. This popular gift option is commonly called the charitable IRA rollover, but you may also see it referred to as a qualified charitable distribution (QCD).  
Your disbursement must come directly from the administrator of your IRA to the Parish - you should not receive the funds first. The check should be made payable to the Parish Please request a notation with the gift to include: Your Name and Your Parish  
Please have the check mailed to your parish office. The Parish is a qualified charity. An EIN or Tax ID# is available by calling the Wayne County Parishes business office at 315-524-2611. Please consult with your tax advisor or IRA administrator regarding tax or account-specific questions.
