






Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A young couple in my parish told me they were expecting their second child, a baby boy. I knew that their five-year old only child Emma had been desperately wanting to be a big sister for years, so I said, "Emma must have been so happy when you told her the news." "Actually," they said, "she burst into tears. She wanted a baby sister!" How often in life God wonderfully fulfills our desires and we are sad because we don't approve of the way he does it. We want to control the gift and the delivery method.

The same thing occurs in the Gospel this week when Jesus announces in his hometown that the promise of an Anointed One bringing glad tidings to the poor is "fulfilled in your hearing" (Luke 4:21). After a moment of elation, his fellow townsfolk realize this man is the way God is fulfilling his promises, and they erupt into a violent outburst. So Jesus departs. How sad for them.

Every single Sunday at Mass, including this one, some version of this happens to many of us. God's word announces the fulfillment of God's promises in Christ, and we easily overlook or disdain it. His way is almost never according to our narrow expectations. What's required of us is to set these aside, and to embrace a new openness to God's gifts, no matter how he wishes to give them. God is fulfilling his promises the way He likes - why be sad?





"I am the bread of life." John 6:51



The Church teaches that the seven sacraments were instituted by Christ. The sacraments come out of the story of Jesus' life and

actions found in the Bible. For example, baptism calls to mind the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan and the way Jesus gathered a community around himself. It also reminds us of Jesus' command to his Apostles, to carry the gospel to the whole world and to baptize them. The sacrament of Holy Eucharist recalls the Last Supper, whereby Jesus instituted this sacrament. The Gospels also include accounts of other meals when Jesus dined with those rejected by others, sinners, and tax collectors. The sacrament of penance and reconciliation reminds us of Jesus' invitation to receive forgiveness of our sins, and to forgive one another, as He forgave those who put Him to death on the cross. The sacraments also flow from Jesus' values and teachings. He raised basic values and experiences (forgiveness, concern for the sick, marriage, service) to new levels. He transformed oromary human values into spiritual values by helping people see God's love made visible through them. As we celebrate the sacraments, we, like the first followers of Jesus, have the opportunity to encounter Him in our acceptance of the values He lived and affirmed. In that encounter, Jesus is present to us as He was present to His early Church. When Jesus instituted the sacraments and placed Peter at the head of the Church, He gave the apostles, and those who follow them in leading the Church, the mission and authority to minister and maintain the sacraments. Next week, we will start to reflect on each one of the sacraments, beginning with the sacrament of Baptism . Have a Blessed and safe week! Fr.Felician
