

# **FEBRUARY 2, 2025**



Today the church celebrates the Presentation of the Lord in the temple at which time, Mary & Joseph brought a pair of doves to be sacrificed.

February 3rd is the feast of St. Blaise.

St. Blaise, in Latin Blasius, also called Blazey, was born, in Asia Minor, Turkey, and died in the year 316 AD. His feast day is February 3rd. St. Blaise was a bishop and martyr, and one of the most popular medieval saints. He is ven-

erated as the patron saint of sufferers from throat diseases and of wool combers. According to tradition, Blaise was of noble birth and, after being educated in the Christian faith, was made Bishop of Sebastia. Although Christianity had been adopted about 300 AD as the state religion in Armenia, the Roman Emperor, Licinius, began a persecution of the Christians, and Blaise was discovered and apprehended. While imprisoned, he miraculously cured a boy from fatally choking. After being torn with wool combers' irons, Blaise was beheaded. Subsequent legends, notably the apocryphal Acts of St. Blaise, claim that, before Blaise was made bishop, he was a physician possessed of wonderful healing power. Numerous miracles were attributed to him, including the cure of diseased beasts during his refuge, thus accounting for his also being the patron saint of wild animals. He was venerated as the patron of sufferers from throat diseases in the East by the 6th century and in the West by the 9th century. Blaise's cult spread throughout Christendom from the 8th century, and many churches, such as that in Dubrovnik (a city of which he is the patron saint), Croatia, are dedicated to him. Laudetur Jesus Christus!



Joseph." It is thought to have originated in the first century A.D. and was sent by the pope to Emperor Charles as he went into battle. It is said that those who recite this prayer will not suffer a sudden death and will likewise be protected from drowning, the effects of poison and fire, falling into the hands of the enemy or being overpowered in battle.



#### Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

What is the secret to sharing in God's power to overcome our difficulties? Mary teaches us this in the prophecy of her pierced heart. This Sunday, the old man Simeon prophecies that when her son faces opposition, Mary's soul will be pierced by a sword. The seemingly pointless agony of a mother helplessly watching her son be mocked, tortured, killed and then cruelly desecrated in death by a spear — somehow this piercing of her heart releases a power by which "the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed" (Luke 2:35). What to make of this?

Whatever problems we currently face, the deepest threat is finally that evil thoughts are hidden in the human heart: hatred, envy, pride, lust, greed and so on. Behind every tyrant's injustice, for example, is a heart unpierced by love. Evil hides in our hearts. Mary's pierced heart, and its suffering love for her son, reveals and scatters these evil thoughts, and replaces them with love, forgiveness, generosity and peace.

This week, I invite us to ponder Mary's pierced heart. Her heart is quietly at work for us in the Church and world, exposing our evil thoughts and making a path for her son's divine love. This is how she gently cooperates in our salvation. Closed hearts are our biggest problem; love-pierced hearts are the ultimate power to overcome every difficulty.

We are Baptized into the Body of Christ. For community has always been an im-

portant and essential part of life. Christ is at the center, and the community is built around Him. Baptism is the way we enter that community and become members of the body of Christ, the Church. Once bap zed, we share in the privileges and the life of this community of believers. Many people think of baptism as a private family affair, but being bap zed connects us in a deep and eternal way with a much larger family: the family of God. Baptism is the sign of salvation given to us by Christ to bring us into the kingdom of God (see John 3:5). A person enters "into Christ" (*Romans 6:3, Gala-tians 3:7*) at the me of baptism, and the gift of the Spirit is given at that me. "We are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him, so that we may be glorified with him." (Romans 8:16-18). As adopted sons and daughters of God, Christians share in Jesus' own relationship with his Father - a relationship so inmate that they, like Jesus, can freely and with every confidence address the Lord of heaven as "Father." Reflect this week. As a child of God, what riches will you inherit through baptism? Secondly, what responsibilities come with those riches? Have a blessed and safe week.
