MARCH 2, 2025 **8TH SUNDAY IN** ORDINARY TIME


This is the last Sunday in Ordinary Time before we begin the holy season of Lent this upcoming week on Ash Wednesday. Even though Ash Wednesday is not a holy day of obligation, it is a day when our Masses our packed with people. Getting the smudge of ash on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday has great symbolism for the Catholic faithful. Every year I look forward to the holy season of Lent as a time to renew my faith and to prepare in a meaningful way for Easter and the paschal mysteries.

This weekend, right before we start the holy season of Lent this Wednesday, we hear a portion of Jesus' sermon on the plain from Luke's Gospel. We have heard from the sermon on the plain three weeks in a row. The Beatitudes from the sermon on the plain were one of the readings we reflected upon in our synodal listening sessions. Last Sunday, we heard Jesus tell us to love our enemies, to turn the other cheek, and to judge not lest we be judged. But, then today, we hear Jesus tell us that we need to look at our own faults and our own failings before we criticize our brother. The message we get from Jesus is that criticism is not bad in itself, but that it should be constructive, positive criticism. We are not to judge or brother as a putdown or out of our own righteousness, but rather to help our brother in our correction of him, doing so in a helpful way.

With faith, hope, and humility, we will journey together with Jesus during this holy season of Lent. Blessings to all of you - we will see you all at Mass on Ash Wednesday!





If the Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated separate from Confirmation, as in the case of infants and young children, the Priest or Deacon anoints the

newly baptized with Chrism, olive oil mixed with balsam, and consecrated by the Bishop. This anointing is a sign that God has "put a seal upon us and given us the Spirit in our hearts as a first installment" (2 Corinthians 1:22). It is a sign that the baptized person shares in the kingly, prophetic, and priestly mission of Christ. After the anointing with Sacred Chrism, the minister presents a white garment and a lit candle to the newly baptized, the parents, and godparents. The white garment symbolizes becoming a new creation and being clothed in Christ: "For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourself with Christ." (Galatians 3:27). The candle is lit from the Paschal Candle or Easter Candle, which represents the risen Christ. The lighted candle is a reminder that Christ, the light of the world, is their light and that they must "live as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8). Next week we will conclude our reflection on the Sacrament of Baptism. Have a wonderful and blessed week. Fr. Felicjan
