

Today is the feast of Pentecost. On this day, we mark the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles, which is also the birthday of the Church. This mystery is the third of the five glorious mysteries of the Holy Rosary. The liturgy of Pentecost brings the Easter season to a close. After today, we shall return to the ordinary time of the Church's year, and we shall switch from praying the Regina Caeli to the

Angelus. The word Pentecost is originally from the Greek he Pentecoste hemera, which means "the fiftieth day". It is called so because it falls on the fiftieth day after the Passover. It began as a harvest festival among the Jews. It is one of the three great Jewish festivals to which every male Jew living within twenty miles from Jerusalem was legally bound to attend (cf Exodus 23:14-17; 22-23). The three Annual feasts that bring all adult male Jews to Jerusalem include the Passover, the Pentecost and the feast of Tabernacles. The crowd that gathered when the Apostles received the Holy Spirit were not in Jerusalem for the Holy Spirit; they were there for their annual Pentecost Celebration to mark fifty days after Passover and to commemorate the anniversary of the giving of the Law at Mount Sinai. So, Pentecost was first observed as an agricultural or harvest feast, later the Jews began to celebrate Pentecost to mark the giving of the Law to the Israelites through Moses on mount Sinai. For us Christians, we celebrate Pentecost fifty days after the Resurrection as the day the Church was given birth to through the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. May the Spirit of the Lord fall afresh on us.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was a seminarian almost 20 years ago, a bank vice president taught us etiquette classes. She said, "Gentlemen, please make sure your breath isn't bad. Take some breath mints before you hear confessions, okay?" We nervously laughed because the proximity that makes breath noticeable (whether pleasant or not) can be a bit awkward.

When Jesus breathes on his Apostles (John 20:22), he must have been within inches of at least some of them. This closeness of his breath has a purpose: the purpose of forgiveness of sins. **"Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them" (John 20:23)**. Why in the world would the almost uncomfortable closeness of his breath forgive sins?

In the Bible, breath is spirit or wind. It comes from above and makes that which is below to have identity. To not have a single identity is to be multiple, divided. The word "sin" comes from an ancient word that means "to split" or "render asunder." Sin divides us sinners and the world around us; our spiritual "breath" leaves us and our identity splinters. Only breath from above restores. For example, a shattered vase is rendered whole because the craftsman breathes the spirit of the vase back into it when he repairs it. A human being shattered by sin is made whole by the breath of God, breathed by Jesus through his priests. His breath alone forgives sins. It's always done with his gentle, loving closeness.




Prayer for Pentecost



The Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit we receive during this sacrament.

•**Wisdom:** Wisdom moves our vision into the future, giving us perspective and enabling us to see things with God's eyes. The gift of wisdom helps us see our joys and sufferings in the light of God's loving plan for us.

•**Understanding:** The world would be easier to understand if it came with instructions. Fortunately, God's gift of Easter life does come with instructions: the sacred Scriptures. Prayerful reading of the Bible helps us understand God's plan.

•**Right Judgement (Counsel):** This is the gift that helps us to make good choices - God's choices. The gift of right judgment helps us seek God's counsel, God's advice. Right judgments are made in light of God's great Final Judgment.

•**Courage (Fortitude):** Courage enables us to face danger and overcome fear with confidence. Before performing a cure, Jesus often told his followers to take courage, take heart, be confident. The gift of courage enables us to see where our real strength lies - in God.

•**Knowledge:** The gift of knowledge helps us to know Jesus, and to discern which things are important, and which aren't. A good way to tell if we are really using the gift of knowledge is to examine whether the things we know lead us to charity in our actions.

•**Reverence (Piety):** Placing us at the foot of Jesus' cross, this gift helps us see our relationship to God: the saved and the Savior. It enables us to act in the light of this reality, and to show our gratitude by our piety and devotion.

•**Wonder and Awe in God's Presence (Fear of the Lord):** It takes time and leisure to wonder, and be amazed, to see God's beauty around us. We might recall the feeling of looking at something amazing in nature, and saying wow! That is this gift in action. Next week we will begin reflecting and meditating on the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist.
