Today, we celebrate the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ or "Corpus Christi". It originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. The feast focuses on two manifestations: the Holy Eucharist as the body of Christ and the Church as the body of Christ. This feast was instituted to

encourage the faithful to give special adoration to the Holy Eucharist. The Holy Eucharist is the presence of Christ in our lives. In the Eucharist, Christ is truly really and substantially present, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. He is truly present in every particle of the Eucharistic bread. The Eucharist is a banquet that Christ himself has prepared for his believing family. When we gather around the table of the Lord to feast, we are unified into one Eucharistic family, the Church. We become a transformed community from strangers to brothers and sisters. In the Eucharist, Jesus offers his own Body and Blood as a ransom for us. That is why he says at the last supper, "This is my body...this is my blood". This culminates in his selfsacrifice on the cross. Thus, at Mass, it is Jesus Christ offering himself for humanity through the action of the priest. On the journey of faith where we meet different experiences, Jesus accompanies us. Sometimes we come across things that weigh us down, making us even question the existence of God in our lives. Our communion with Christ gives us the strength to continue walking even though we do not understand many things and why certain things happen. As Christians, we believe that our life is always in the hand of God. Jesus, the food for our journey does not abandon us to face life alone, but when we remain open to his guidance, we are always led to a place of refuge, where our faith is strengthened by God. The Holy Eucharist is the summit of our faith. When we respond "amen" as we receive his Body and Blood, we affirm that we know, understand and accept what we are receiving. Our responsibility, therefore, is to take the Christ that we have received to others by living a life of faith and love in communion with the people that we meet. Fr. Sylvester



Mini Reflection: Sometimes we forget that we need the Eucharist. It's not just a nice thing to have, a sweet act of devotion, something to bolster our faith. The Eucharist is none of those things. The Eucharist is the food without which we will die

As the Day Was Drawing to a Close It isn't uncommon for me to get to the noon hour only to realize that I haven't yet eaten anything that day.

It drives my husband crazy. He was raised by a bunch of italian women, so he can't help but think three meals ahead. And don't get me wrong, i love food – I literally dream of donuts. But some days. I'm just so busy and I keep putting it off until I realize how weak I feel, how light-headed. And I think to myself: *Stupid, you've done it* aratin

This is what comes to mind today, on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, as I read the Gospel account of the miracle of the loaves and fishes.

I think of hunger, distraction and the poor planning of those who pride themselves on being capable.

"As the day was drawing to a close," it is written — th when the disciples finally realized that 5,000 hangry people is not an ideal situation.

I wonder, did Jesus roll his eyes when they came to him, and think, "Finally"? At any point he could have pulled out a fish and said a blessing. But he waited for them to ask. He waited for them to realize how badly they needed



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A Catholic friend of mine occasionally says, "The Eucharist is not a noun. It's a verb." In so saying, he is making the point that the Eucharist isn't simply Jesus' bodily presence given to us in holy Communion. It also manifests the dynamic pattern by which Christ actively loves and saves us. He teaches us to cooperate with that pattern. This Eucharist actually embodies four verbs: Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. Let's consider each one.

He **takes:** Do we acknowledge that we are totally in God's hands? Do we receive everything in our lives as a gift, and act responsibly with it?

He **blesses:** Do we actively reflect that Jesus makes us holy in our baptism? Do we embrace our bodies and souls as temples of God, worthy of love, peace, and joy?

He **breaks:** Do we run from failure and disappointment, from getting old or being ignored? Are we too worried about getting hurt or sick? Do we embrace our sufferings with confidence?

He gives: Are we willing to make our lives a gift for others? Are we confident that we will always have enough love to give to others, that God will always provide enough for us? Do we rejoice in giving away what we have to others, expecting nothing in return? This is the dynamic life the Eucharist empowers us to live.
