

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

As Catholics, we believe that Jesus Christ is truly present in the Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. This belief, called the **Real Presence**, is at the heart of our faith. At Mass, we receive Christ in Holy Communion, but outside of Mass we also have the opportunity to pray before Him in a special way: **Eucharistic Adoration**.

During Adoration, the consecrated Host is placed in a vessel called a **monstrance** and set upon the altar. In this time of prayer, we come before Jesus in silence, offering Him our praise, thanksgiving, petitions, and love. Simply being in His presence transforms us, just as sitting with a close friend strengthens a friendship.

Why is Adoration so powerful? Because it is not just a symbol—it is Jesus Himself. Just as the Apostles sat at His feet and listened, we too are invited to sit with Him, gaze upon Him, and let Him gaze upon us. In Adoration, we slow down, open our hearts, and allow Christ to speak to us in the quiet of prayer.

Sadly, many Catholics today struggle to believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This is why the Church is calling us for a renewal of faith and devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Here at the Parishes of Eastern Wayne County, we are blessed to take part and opportunities for Adoration. We invite you to come, spend time with the Lord, and experience His peace and love in a deeper way.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

One hot Arizona summer afternoon my car ran out of gas. I phoned the parish office and begged for help. My secretary came and helped me fill the gas tank. She chided me, "If you can't manage getting your car from A to B, how can we expect you to guide the parish where it needs to go?" Point taken, Julie. I vowed to always make sure I have plenty of gas in my car.

The Lord Jesus chides us in this week's Gospel, too. He uses the two images of a man building a tower and a king marching soldiers into war to make this single point: acquire what is needed to follow him or look ridiculous. We rightly mock the builder who lacks money for his tower and the king with a short-handed army. But our mocking boomerangs back on us. How do we expect to follow Jesus to the end with insufficient detachment from our possessions and divided hearts?

The good news is, there is still time. Jesus is building a great tower to heaven-his own body. So we renounce all and give ourselves to him as his precious stones. Jesus is waging a battle against our enemy. So we forsake all and swear allegiance and march under his banner. In this way, we will finish what has begun in our discipleship. Or better put, our Lord will have the stones and soldiers required to see his great work through.

For the past several weeks we've been looking at LIATION what impact sin makes in our lives. How it alienates us from God, our church, and our loved ones. When sin is left untreated, it can corrode our lives and distance our relationship with God and others. However, we can turn to Jesus for forgiveness of our sins and be reconciled. We can be made whole again, thanks be to God!! The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation can be celebrated <u>individually or in a communal service.</u> When I was assigned at Sacred Heart in Auburn, during the seasons of Advent and Lent, we would have a communal service. A communal service would include hymns, scripture readings, homily, an examination of conscience and prayer. Priests would gather inside various parts of the church to hear individual confessions. Both rites include individual confession and absolution. Communal services usually take place in larger parishes, and priests from nearby parishes come to assist. We prepare for the sacrament through an examination of conscience, reflecting on our lives and the choices we've made. We may use the Ten Commandments and teachings of Jesus to guide our examination. We reflect on how generous - or selfish - our response to God and others have been. To be forgiven, we must show contrition, sorrow for our sins, and be resolved to follow Jesus' command to the woman caught in adultery, "from now on do not sin anymore" (John 8:11). We will continue next week on exploring the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Have a wonderful and safe week! Fr. Felicjan




