THE PRAYER WHICH THE DISCIPLES REQUESTED TO BE TAUGHT

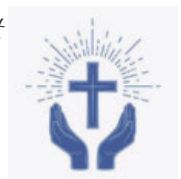
BY JESUS CHRIST:

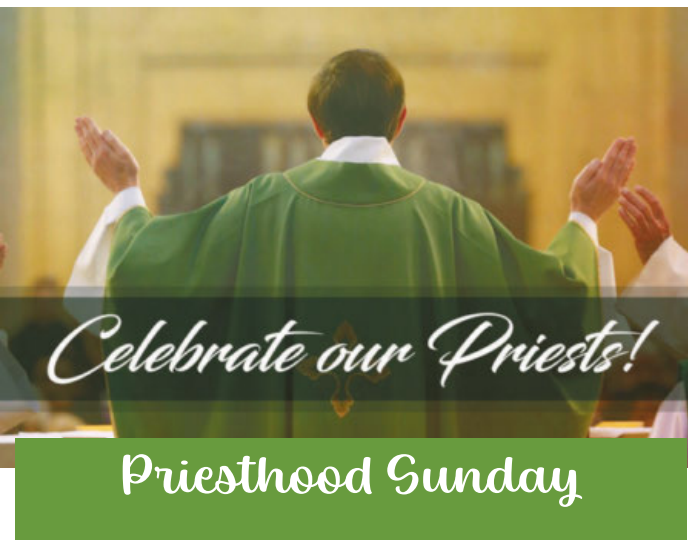

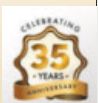

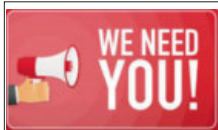

RECONCILIATION

Today we conclude our reflection on the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Last week we finished by reciting the Act of Contrition after we confessed our sins to the priest. After the recitation of the Act of Contrition prayer, the priest extends his right hand over us and makes the prayer of absolution. Hearing God's forgiveness with our ears meets a basic human need. This prayer completes and seals our change of heart. It signifies God's forgiveness of us and our reconciliation with the church: "...May God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

When we leave the confessional, **we have been forgiven of the sins we confessed and the sins we unintentionally omitted.** We perform our penance which the priest gave us to do. We make a new beginning.
