# TWENTY-SEVEN SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### OCTOBER- MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

The Church dedicates October to the prayer of the Rosary, one of the most beloved devotions of Catholics throughout the world. The Rosary is more than a series of prayers—it is a way of meditating on the mysteries of Christ's life through the eyes of His Blessed Mother.

# Where did the Rosary come from?

The roots of the Rosary go back to the early Middle Ages. Monks and religious prayed the 150 Psalms daily, but many lay people, unable to read or memorize all the Psalms, began substituting 150 "Our Fathers" or "Hail Marys." Over time, these prayers were organized into groups of decades, each linked to a reflection on an event in the life of Jesus and Mary.

Tradition also connects the Rosary with St. Dominic (13th century), who promoted it as a powerful weapon of faith against error and sin. While the form we know today developed gradually, St. Dominic's zeal helped spread devotion to Mary through the Rosary.

The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary

In 1571, Pope St. Pius V called Christians to pray the Rosary for victory as Europe faced a great threat. After the Christian fleet triumphed at the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, he established the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary to honor Mary's intercession. From that time forward, October has been closely tied to this prayer.

#### Why pray the Rosary today?

Pope after pope has recommended the Rosary as a simple yet profound path of prayer. St. John Paul II called it "a compendium of the Gospel," because in its mysteries we relive the central events of salvation history. It can be prayed privately, in families, or in groups—anywhere and at any time.

Through the Rosary we:

- \* Reflect on Christ's Incarnation, Passion, and Resurrec-
- \* Ask Mary to intercede for us and lead us closer to her
- \* Find peace in repetitive prayer that draws our hearts into God's presence.

As we enter October, let us renew our love for the Rosary. Whether one decade or the full twenty mysteries, every

prayer offered is a step closer to Christ, through the heart of His Mother. Praised be Lord Jesus Christ!





**Gospel Meditation** 

**Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture** A priest friend of mine received a call from a family whose elderly mother was dying. Within thirty minutes, he was at her bedside, offering the consolation of the sacraments, anointing her with the oil of the sick and commending her soul to God. She passed not long after and for months her family spoke of their deep gratitude for his presence. When I phoned him to commend his faithful minis-

try, he simply said, "I was just doing my job." His words brought to mind Jesus' teaching this week in Luke 17:10: "So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, "We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty." In a world that often seeks recognition and applause, the Lord invites us into a different mindset—one of humble service. The priest did not see is response as extraordinary: he saw it as a grace to fulfill his vocation. How tempting it is to seek affirmation for doing what I ought to do! Yet Jesus reminds us that true discipleship is not about grandto do: It is enough to have served. It is enough to have served. It is enough to have loved. It is enough to do our duty in the first place. Whether in priesthood, parenthood, or any vocation, what peace-soaked freedom there is in simply doing what is asked of us. No more, no less. Jesus, that is how you quietly love us.

Anointing Today we begin to reflect on The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Just like the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, is a

Sacrament of healing. Jesus was concerned about people's physical as well as spiritual health. In fact, the word salvation is derived from the Latin "salus," which means "health." In announcing the good news of salvation, Jesus was declaring that God cares for us completely body, soul, and spirit.
